SUBJECT: Emergency Preparedness

Definition

Emergency Situation – is a situation requiring evacuation or closure of schools, or change in transportation in situation where students might be at risk, including but not limited to breakdown of heating system, fire, flood, tornado, inclement weather, bomb threats, explosives, and chemical spills.

Emergency Procedures Plans

System Plan: The “Emergency Procedures Manual” provides guidelines for the development and implementation of school plans.

School Plan: Each Principal is required to develop a comprehensive school plan and set of procedures as outlined in the “Emergency Procedures Manual”. This plan will incorporate awareness, alternative accommodation, communication with parents, safety of students and staff, and security of premises. This plan will be clear, well known to staff, students, and parents and ready for implementation when necessary.

System and School: The school plan, and subsequent procedures, will be formulated to not only allow for the school’s uniqueness but also to meet the need for the school to act in concert with the system.
