Students Received Queen Elizabeth II Aiming For the Top Scholarships

One Hundred and twenty-two Lambton Kent District School Board students have won the Province's Queen Elizabeth II Aiming for the Top Scholarships. The program from the Ontario Government rewards students who graduate with top marks at their high school, and who plan to continue their studies at an Ontario college or university. Students who maintain an 80 per cent average at the postsecondary level can receive these scholarships, which are worth up to a maximum of \$3,500. per year, for up to four years in total. This year, the Government is investing \$35 million in Queen Elizabeth II Aiming for the Top Scholarships that are being issued to 14,466 students across Ontario.
