Zones of Regulation

New Volunteer and Volunteer Driver Policies

We have revised Volunteer and Volunteer Driver Policies in the board.

The following volunteers require a Police Vulnerable Sector Check (PVSC) every five years and must undergo the formal screening process and provide an annual Offence Declaration: a) Parent/guardians and community volunteers who assist in the school on a daily or weekly basis b) elementary parents/guardians and community volunteers on overnight excursions of any kind

c) Parent/guardians and community volunteers accompanying secondary students on overnight excursions with exceptions only to be approved by the principal and the Superintendentd) non-parent, non-guardian volunteers not known to the school community

e) volunteer drivers of any students under the age of 18.

f) others, as deemed necessary by the principal.

In addition to the police check, I need to provide an orientation to the school, discuss requirements of confidentiality, discipline and disclosure of abuse. The volunteer must complete the volunteer agreement form. The principal must keep all of this on file in a binder in the office.

Volunteer Drivers:

When it comes to approved school excursions (e.g., field trips, sporting events), parents cannot transport children other than their own during the instructional day (9:20 a.m. - 3:40 p.m.) unless they have fulfilled the requirements to be a volunteer driver (police vulnerable sector check, carry a million dollars of personal liability insurance, they are at least 21, have a G license and have filled in the necessary forms). This policy is driven by legislation, safety of students and liability.

We will make every effort to provide a bus to and from school excursions to avoid needing to use volunteer drivers, but we have asked parents if they are willing to fulfill the requirements if we should need to call on them.

Presentations and Events

Respect Revolution was here on October 14th. It is a group of students who put on a dynamic musical presentation. The message of this presentation was about respect, dignity and trying to make a difference to stop bullying.

Mad Science Demonstration the afternoon of October 14th. They will again be running a 6 week after school science club that kids can sign up for.
