Playground Safety

This is a reminder that students must not wear backpacks, scarves, or coats with drawstrings while playing on the playground equipment. Some safety tips from Health Canada are as follows:

- Before using the playground, remove helmets, scarves, and drawstrings
- Remove anything that could strangle your child -take off any strings or drawstrings from clothing
- Use clips instead of strings to hold mittens to clothing
- Wear a neck warmer instead of a scarf
- Be sure to put aside skipping ropes before climbing on the equipment



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
