
# **Cross Country**

# Orange Shirt Day- National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

During the last week in September, students were engaged in many age-appropriate conversations and activities relating to residential schools and the impact they have had and continue to have on Indigenous people. One of the activities that many students participated in was a painting session with Moses, an artist from Anishinabek (Ojibway/Chippewa) Nation in Kettle and Stony Point, Ipperwash, Ontario. This was a fantastic opportunity for students where they were able to do art and learn through this experience. As well, on September 29<sup>th</sup> a large number of students wore orange shirts to honour the children and families impacted by residential schools.
