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Cell Phones and Electronic Devices

All electronic devices, such as cell phones, digital game devices, computers are not to be used while the student is on school property before, during, or after school without the permission of school personnel and may only be used for educational purposes under the guidance and supervision of staff. At no time will students use electronic devices for digital, audio or video recording without permission from the teacher. The school is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen property.

Communication

Communication between home and school is key to your child's success. Primary communication from administration will be through phone or email. If you had previously declined receiving email notifications from the school, we ask that you consider allowing for email communication from the school so that you can receive newsletters, forms, and any pertinent information to the school year.

Safe Arrival and Dismissal

<u>School Arrival</u>: Students are expected to arrive at school <u>no earlier than 8:40 am.</u> as their safety on the yard cannot be monitored without a staff member present. Classes will begin at 8:55 am. Parents are asked to remain off the yard. Students in JK and SK may be brought to their ECE by the parent for 'handoff' but are asked to leave the yard. Parents can help their child find their line-up on the first day but are asked to then wait outside the fence. Pylons with teachers' names will be on the primary yard to help students find their bags.

Dismissal Procedures: Students who walk or are getting picked-up should be met at a pre-appointed spot on the yard. Older students will be dismissed at the bell to collect younger siblings/students. It is important that you practice this meeting spot ahead of time. Parents are asked to wait outside school property until the bell rings as classes are often outside to play at the end of the day.

Early Pick Up: Should there be a need to arrange an earlier pick-up time, please call the school office and ask that the message be given to the teacher and

your child through the office. To avoid this, we ask that parents please call the school before 2:50 pm to make alternate pick-up arrangements.
