Message from the Principal

As this school year draws to a close, I would like to thank all members of the Lancer Community for their contributions throughout the school year. We have an outstanding program of academics, athletics, and activities. We couldn't do it without the enthusiasm and involvement of students, staff, parents, and our wonderful community.

Final Exams

Final exams are scheduled to be written on June 22, 23, 26 and 27. If buses are canceled then the entire exam schedule will be moved to the next day. Therefore, it is important that students be available to write until June 29. Students are expected to write all their exams and complete all their culminating activities. A mark of zero will be assigned for a missed exam unless we have received a note from a doctor documenting illness, or a note from a lawyer documenting a court appearance. Students will not be permitted to write exams early for reasons related to summer employment, vacation, sports or mission/humanitarian trips.

Demonstration of Learning Students in our applied math, science, English, history and geography classes are part of our Demonstration of Learning project. Students will receive a letter on June 21 indicating whether or not they have achieved the Demonstration of Learning standard. Students who do achieve the standard are not required to write the final exam.

Summer Office Hours

During July and August, the school office will be open Tuesday through Thursday from 8am– 3pm.

Report Cards

Report cards will be mailed on June 30. Student achievement data is finalized and sent to the Ministry of Education and post-secondary institutions in early July. The Administration Team is available to address any concerns until the end of the day on July 7.

Summer Semester

This year, the summer semester will be offered at Great Lakes Secondary School (SCI&TS campus) and John McGregor Secondary School in Chatham. Brochures and application forms have arrived at LCCVI and can be picked up in the Student Services office or viewed online at

Requests for Timetable Changes in September

From Tuesday, August 29 through to Friday, September 8 our counsellors will **only** be dealing with a large number of new student registrations and those student timetable issues arising from the June, 2017 promotion meetings. All other students are expected to follow their current timetables. Beginning on **Monday, September 11** students can make requests for appointments to discuss possible timetable changes. Please be aware that many courses are currently full and have waiting lists.

Any requests will be prioritized based on the following situations and seen in a priority sequence:

- 1. Errors in timetabling
- 2. Failing of sequential courses
- 3. Summer school results
- 4. A change in plans or requirements for
- post-secondary educational plans
- 5. Health problems
- 6. A compulsory credit essential for diploma purposes (O.S.S.D.)
- 7. A clear imbalance in workload between semesters

8. A change which would alleviate overcrowding in specific classes.
