A Message from the Nicol Community Scholarship Fund

This year is the 30th anniversary since the Helen Kavanagh Nicol Scholarship was established after the death of Harold Robert Madden Nicol. Mr. Nicol attended LCCVI in 1914 before enlisting in WWI. He was injured at The Battle of the Somme and was sent back to Canada. He eventually made his way to Chicago and worked there for the rest of his life.

When Mr. Nicol learned he was dying, he decided to establish the Helen Kavanagh Nicol Scholarship in honour of his mother and sister. He wanted his money to go to young people at LCCVI. His legacy is strong. Since 1987 nearly 400 Lancers have received Nicol Scholarships.

The Nicol Scholarship has helped those individual students benefit financially, but there has also been a benefit to the greater community. The scholarship has indirectly built a culture of generosity, service to others, and community engagement around LCCVI. In 2016 a group of Nicol recipients came together to ensure that the spirit and gift of the Nicol Scholarship continues at LCCVI. As the original scholarship funds diminish, we are hoping to create an endowment fund to ensure the scholarship continues in the future.

Please help us to continue the Nicol Scholarship by spreading the word to former Nicol scholars and their families, local businesses, service clubs, and individual members of the community that donations are welcome. If the whole community comes together then we can all help to ensure Mr. Nicol's legacy continues at LCCVI.
