Celebrating Black History Month



This month, Black History and African Heritage is being celebrated by the Lambton Kent District School Board (LKDSB). In recognition of Black History/African Heritage during February, the LKDSB is focused this year on Black History/African Heritage Month, "Black Joy".

There is a wealth of information available about the contributions that Black Canadians have and are making in Canada and around the world.

Local Black Historic Sites

Buxton National Historic Site: Buxton National Historic Site aims to provide educational programming to support students in gaining a better understanding of the roots of racial prejudices, as well as the progress that has been made since the era of the Underground Railroad in eradicating those prejudices from our society. The museum's main purpose is to collect, preserve, exhibit, and interpret historical artifacts related to the Elgin (Buxton) Settlement from its founding in 1849 to the late 19th century.

Chatham-Kent Black Historical Society/Black Mecca Museum: The Chatham-Kent Black Historical Society celebrates black history in the Municipality of Chatham-Kent and the City of Chatham. Click here to take a virtual tour.

Josiah Henson Museum of African-Canadian History: The Josiah Henson Museum commemorates the life of Rev. Josiah Henson (1796-1883). This historic site recognizes Rev. Henson's contributions to the abolition movement and his work in the Underground Railroad, as well as his connection to Harriet Beecher Stowe's novel Uncle Tom's Cabin. https://www.heritagetrust.on.ca/
