SARNIA ON Feb 10, 2017 -- Getting secondary students to and from co-op placements and other appointments just got a little easier for Alexander Mackenzie Secondary School (A.M.S.S.) thanks to a recent donation of a Chevrolet Uplander passenger van from Enbridge Pipelines Inc.
