Program

The summer dual credit program allows students to take an online college course that counts towards both the Ontario Secondary School Diploma and a post-secondary certificate, diploma, or apprenticeship training program.

Courses

Digital Photography

This online course is an introduction to the fundamentals of digital photography using a DSLR camera or mobile device, such as a smartphone or tablet. The course focuses on the technical aspects associated with a DSLR by using a free app called Lightroom Mobile. Lightroom Mobile allows a mobile device's camera to replicate a DSLR in order to give students full-creative control. The assignments have been designed to promote technical, creative and critical thinking while encouraging the students to take a practical approach at capturing quality images.

The Great Outdoors

This course introduces learners to the cultural and social dimensions of sustainability in the outdoors with a focus on the relationships of human beings to their environment, to each other, and to the world at large. Incorporating community partner specialists and discovery learning activities, students explore habitat and ecosystem relationships, resource use and management, sustainability, individual and group wellness.

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Methodology

This is a technical course that provides practical, hands-on learning. All content is delivered in a live-virtual classroom hosted daily using platforms such as Zoom and/or Microsoft Teams. Communication with the instructor, along with content, is accessible to students through the learning platform D2L. The hardware requirements for this course are minimal. Students will need a mobile device to participate; a computer is only required if a student chooses to use their own personal DSLR. This course will consist of live demonstrations, theory and practical exercises to emphasize digital photography principles, techniques and equipment as it applies to the professional photographer. Students will be required to complete and submit assignments and/or quizzes daily to demonstrate their understanding of these concepts.

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Methodology

This is an online course. This course consists of lectures, discussion, and film/video presentations. Course work and activities are provided in an online format. Learners should expect several required field assignments to be held while studying at home, as well as the requirement to complete and submit assignments and/or quizzes daily to demonstrate their understanding of concepts.
