<p>Vimy Ridge Secondary School,</p> <p>Vimy Ridge Memorial Secondary School,</p> <p>Vimy Ridge High School,</p> <p>Vimy Ridge Memorial High School</p>	<p>Our new renamed school will be functioning in September 2017. The Battle of Vimy Ridge was fought in April 1917 (began April 9, 1917). The world and in particular Canada will recognize the 100 year anniversary of this important historical event for our nation in 2017. As citizens of Canada we will also be celebrating 150 years of Confederation in 2017. The significance of all three of these events in 2017 has prompted this idea. It would be fitting as a new generation of Canadian students enter this consolidated school that its name reflects a time in our Nations history where many historians and great writers, consider the Canadian victory at Vimy a defining moment for Canada, when the country emerged from under the shadow of Britain and felt capable of greatness. What a legacy is that for our newest generation as surely the feeling of achieving greatness in whatever we do, can be an inspiration for our students as they move forward. Also equally important to all Canadians, present and hopefully all in future, is that we remember the sacrifices of Canadians who have served this great Nation to provide us the freedom and opportunities presented to us. While Vimy Ridge was a defining moment in our history as a Nation, it did come with enormous sacrifice. Over 3598 Canadians were killed and another 7,000 were wounded in this battle for freedom. A Victory at significant cost is something that as a Canadian we must never forget.</p> <p>Canadians would act with courage throughout the battle. Four Canadians would earn the Victoria Cross, our country's highest medal for military valour. The capture of Vimy was seen as more than just an important battlefield victory.</p> <p>For the first time all four of our Canadian divisions attacked together, where soldiers from all regions of Canada were present at the battle. Brigadier-General A.E. Ross declared after the war, "in those few minutes I witnessed the birth of a nation." I am not an historian, however when I consider that we will reach 100 years since this great achievement for our Country in 2017, I simply believe this would be a terrific legacy to honour our past in this way, but also to encourage remembrance for our future generations. Should the committee see fit to consider this school name, I would also suggest consideration for adopting a school team name that might include one of the following: Valiants - This would honour valiant men and women who gave wartime service to Canada during the last of four centuries. While I considered Sarnia and Sarnia South, as well as Murphy Road or Wellington Street as possibilities for names, I felt alone none of these would best capture who the school serves. While I suppose there could be an argument that none of the names submitted fully defines the geographic area of which the facility will serve, I think that argument might apply to any of our schools. What I did try and accomplish with the names was to move from the past, yet capture an identity that the majority of the students who will attend could embrace. The only name that I personally would not favour (if I was a student which I am not) is West Lambton Secondary School. The reason I would not favour this name is simply that it is too broad of a school name or identifier. It meets the general criteria, however would not be at the top of my list, unless it was the only public high/secondary school in West Lambton. The remaining names I believe should all offer students; parents; administration and the community stakeholders the ability to see where the name could align with their geographic area. I removed the word St. Clair from St. Clair Parkway, as I understand names that included reference to SCITS or St. Clair would not be considered. While I would have preferred to keep such an important geographic indicator as St. Clair, I still believe anyone who is living or has lived in this region could still easily identify with Parkway. The importance of Parkway is that the road/communities stretches from Sarnia to the North to beyond Bickford Line to the South. As this encompasses the geographic area the facility will serve. The use of District or South was to try and further define the geographic area, but not sure I have succeeded on this score. The South was to identify the portion of Sarnia that the school will serve as well it aligned with communities that it will serve that is actually south of Sarnia. The names under Bluewater are proposed to again capture the communities the school will serve, yet include a somewhat dual historic name. All communities the school will serve can identify with Bluewater as a historic regional name they live in. But also this name is historic in that the community of Bluewater once resided in the area this school will serve. It also was a community sitting in the middle of yet another historical name in our Community. That being Chemical Valley. The name Bluewater Valley was an idea that attempted to bring together all of our communities that the school will serve. I believe most people in those communities identify with both Bluewater and the Valley. I believe all of the names that were submitted in this specific criteria are appropriate names for the new consolidated school, but I recognize that they may not be perfect or preferred by the larger stakeholders. I hope though they are considered as possible candidates. Should the committee see fit to consider any of the above school names in this criteria, I would then suggest consideration of one of the following names for school teams: Thunderbirds - This name would align with Ojibwe tradition. His departure comes after the Alberta-born man, following globe-trotting teaching gigs in Sierra Leone and Barbados, arrived in Sarnia in 1955 to teach math at SCITS. From there, he rose to director of the public school board before going on to stints as an administrator with Community Awareness Emergency Response (CAER), as a teacher at Lambton College, and as an instructor at faculties of education in Hamilton, London, Windsor and others. The father of four has also acted as chairperson at the United Way, secretary of the annual Central Forum speaker series, and held dozens of other volunteer positions. "When he was first superintendent, he was quite a different kind of person than normally became superintendents," said Brain. Most were status-quo backers, he said. Wells' biting humour and propensity to see the best in people are also credits to his character, he said. "I wish him well." Wells, who in recent years authored a biography of former Prime Minister William Lyon Mackenzie King, said he would have preferred to stay in Sarnia, but it makes sense to be closer to family.
