Reports from First Nation Communities	<p><u>Vicki Ware, Aamjiwnaang First Nation</u> - The school is open, fully operational and are in the process of developing sugar bush curriculum. Report cards are going home this week. We are working with secondary schools to obtain co-op placements for the students, are finding our biggest hurdle is finding transportation to return the students home. We are working together with AMSS to create a better space for our students. Family day activities as well as bullying awareness activities are being offered. Junior Kindergarten registration is open and we are working on transitioning students from the childcare program into the Junior Kindergarten classroom. Special Education is our area of focus for transportation and strategic planning.</p> <p><u>Bob Bressette, Kettle and Stony Point</u> - Bob reported Hillside is resuming full time in person learning as well as extra-curricular programs. - Gearing up for report card week. Students are happy that the cafeteria will be operational once again. Students in grades 4-8 went ice fishing at the lake and had a wonderful time.</p>	
Trustee: Lareina Rising	<p>- Updates – The board has made an announcement that the land has been purchased for the new K-12 school in Forest. The board wide demographic census will be sent out shortly. The board is looking at Rosedale Public School to re-design the student drop-off area and a refresh within the school. Secondary Schools are back to a regular semester. The school board opted to request a parent be present if they wish their child to be vaccinated at in school vaccination clinics.</p>	

Indigenous Lead - Dallas Sinopole	<p><u>BAP Online Template</u> - Dallas shared the online template and briefly explained the different sections. The Indigenous team has started to think about how the money will be spent that the board has received.</p> <p><u>Springtime Student Symposium</u> - The board has some deferred money from last year's BAP, so the team has decided that some of it will be used for a student symposium. There are, however, some challenges to keep cohorts separated on the bus. There has been some discussion around possibly rotating it through the communities.</p>	
Superintendent Helen Lane	<p><u>Demographic Data Census</u> -The board is in the final stages of launching the demographic data project. We have been working with a researcher through OESC that's able to guide the work that's being done. The information was launched this week and the hope is that students will participate so we can understand who our students are to better meet their needs.</p> <p>- The Ministry has provided us with a pilot program for an Indigenous Intermediate coach that would be supporting students in Grade seven and eight to ease the transition into high school. - It's exciting to see the secondary students back to a regular semester with four courses so they can experience a more traditional semester. - Report cards are being sent home. - Transitions are happening across all schools to help students and transitions will be the focus moving forward.</p>	-
