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Presentations/Video Clips	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adam introduced Kendra C. a Grade 6 student at Thamesville Area; Kendra shared a presentation displaying projects she’s completed with the assistance of an iPad, using Apps such as Knowledgehook and SpellingCity, and more • Sheila introduced Olivia R. who is in Grade 4 at London Road; Olivia shared a video highlighting how far she’s come in learning to self-regulate and take sensory breaks as needed; the Principal and staff of the school spoke highly of Olivia’s progress and the teamwork in place between the school and Pathways • Carolyn and Sheila introduced William L. who is in Grade 8 at W.J. Baird; William is involved in the enrichment program, including CORE • He spoke about all of the things that he’s learning and how important being able to be in this program has been to his educational and social development and shared details of a project on vertical gardening, etc. • Bruce introduced Cameron O. a Grade 12 student at AMSS, and his teacher John Dunseith; Cameron is in an apprenticeship training standard welding class and recently attended Skills Ontario where he won Gold, and then Skills Canada in Edmonton where he won Silver; he’s already had job offers for when he graduates; Cameron will be able to compete at the Worlds as an Apprentice and will keep training with his teacher to prepare • Bruce introduced Greta Saklak who is the Options Teacher; she was in attendance with Nathaniel C. who is in the Options Program, and Tony C., a graduate of the program • Greta outlined the program’s history, mandate, areas of concentration and the application process, and noted that they work closely with Community Living to support program participants • Nathaniel spoke about the two jobs he holds, and Tony spoke about his job; both are very happy with the support they’ve received to help them become independent • Jack asked if there was special funding for the Options Program?; Bruce said any student with an IEP is allowed to stay in the program until they turn 21 years old • Angie informed SEAC that the Board has received Ministry funding and will be working to replicate the program in the North • A video was shown that illustrates a day in the life of Dylan T., a student at Grand Bend; Dylan uses his Tobii Dynavox to communicate and participate at school • Angie Moule spoke about the funding received for the After-School Social Skills Program at AMSS; a video was shared that showed students discussing the ways in which they’ve been able to learn to communicate with their peers because of the program
