Cori highlighted the different tools educators use to engage students and ensure every student can succeed, e.g. Creating Culture, Visuals, Visual Schedules, Sensory Breaks, Calming Spots, and Accommodated Tasks Understanding that "Fair isn't everyone getting the same thingFair is everybody getting what they need to be successful." 		
October 31, 2023, Exceptional Pupil Numbers	 Superintendent Barrese spoke about the October 31, 2023, Report, noting that there were 825 elementary and 1,479 secondary pupils identified, for a total of 2,304 exceptional pupils. As well she pointed out that 1,361 elementary and 883 secondary pupils, for a total of 2,244 pupils, aren't formally identified but have an IEP Superintendent Barrese noted that the ministry collects data in various ways and has specific criteria determining an exceptionality. The number of identified students does not have an impact on funding.
