BUS INFORMATION/MySBI - BUS STATUS APP

Getting information about school bus cancellations and delays is easy! C.L.A.S.S. has a mobile app that will provide subscribers with real-time notifications whenever buses are delayed by ten minutes or greater. For bussing and weather information, Bosanquet Central is in Bus Zone #1. If you choose to drive your child/children to school when the buses are cancelled due to inclement weather, you will need to pick them up at the end of the school day at 3:30 p.m.

SCHOOL MESSENGER ATTENDANCE REPORTING

At the Lambton Kent District School Board, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring students have arrived safely at school every day. You may have received notification about your child's absence from our School Messenger automated attendance messaging system. We have now added a School Messenger Parent/Guardian Reporting Tool for you to notify the school about your child's absence.

Parents/guardians can use School Messenger in one of the following three ways to report your child's absence:

- Option 1: Call a toll-free number and follow the prompts.
- Option 2: Set up a secure online School Messenger account and login to a website.
- Option 3: Download and set up the School Messenger app (Apple or Android) to a smart phone or tablet.

VISITORS PARENTS & GUARDIANS

Before attending school, all visitors must complete and follow the directions of the daily COVID-19 School Screening assessment tool. Visitors must also wear a medical mask while on school premises and complete the sign-in log available in the front foyer. Communication between parents/guardians and teaching staff or administration will continue to be conducted through phone calls or email. Pre-arranged appointments can be made for in-person visits.

2021 SCHOOL CLIMATE SURVEYS-EVERY VOICE COUNTS

We want students and parents/guardians to share their thoughts about our school climate and whether you consider our school to be a safe and welcoming environment. The Lambton Kent District School Board is conducting a School Climate Survey October 12-29, 2021, to gather input from students in Grades 4-12, parents/guardians, and staff to inform program planning and support safe, welcoming, and inclusive school environments. All students in Grades 4-12 will be invited to participate in the online survey during school hours. Any parent/guardian who does not wish for their child to participate should contact the school principal prior to October 7, 2021.

Parents/guardians: You are also invited to share your thoughts on the Parent/Guardian School Climate Survey from October 4-22, 2021. The link will be distributed to parents/guardians with an email on file.

The link will also be posted on our school website. Surveys will be anonymous and individualized results will be kept confidential; however aggregated school and Board responses will be shared publicly (except in cases where individuals may be identified). It is expected the survey results will be publicly available in Fall 2021.

VIOLENCE THREAT RISK ASSESSMENT PROTOCOL

The Lambton Kent District School Board is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors, and community members. When a student behaves inappropriately, principals will most often employ progressive discipline strategies to help a student take responsibility for their actions, learn from their mistakes, and make better choices in the future.

In more extreme cases however, when a student's behaviour poses a potential threat to their own or others' well-being, the Community Violence Threat Risk Assessment Protocol (VTRA) supports principals in taking further steps to safeguard everyone.

VIOLENCE THREAT RISK ASSESSMENT PROTOCOL (con't)

The VTRA protocol outlines how a school responds immediately to threatening incidents including but not limited to: possession of a weapon or replica weapon, bomb threat or plan, verbal or written (including electronic) threats to harm oneself or others, other threats of violence, and fire setting.

The initial response team is likely to include the Principal / Vice-Principal, police, and board staff. Should conditions warrant, a Community Threat Assessment Team will be convened. This community team includes representatives of community agencies who work with schools and boards to keep our students and staff safe, such as local police and children's mental health organizations. Parents and guardians will be notified if their child will be discussed through the Community Violence Threat Risk Assessment Protocol.

If parents/guardians cannot be reached, or if they choose not to provide consent, but a concern for safety still exists due to threatening behaviour, the threat assessment may still proceed.


