## Growth Mindset in Math

In general, a growth mindset is the belief that intelligence and 'smartness' can also be learned and that the brain grows from experience and effort. The opposite, a fixed mindset, is the idea that you are smart, or you are not. In math, that translates into "some people are good at math, and some are not." Did you know that praising efforts rather than intelligence or results can impact your child's ability to persevere in challenges?! The goal is to have children thrive on challenges and see failures, not as a sign of low intelligence, but as a learning opportunity. Brain research tells us that making mistakes actually wires more connections into the brain! When a person has a growth mindset, they accept challenges, see their efforts as worthwhile, and are open to learning from mistakes. Students with a growth mindset achieve at higher levels than those with fixed mindsets. How can you help? Some simple ways:

- Adding "yet" when they claim they are "not good at this" (Respond: "You are not good at this yet.")
- Ask questions that focus on their effort and choices and get them to reflect on satisfaction of that effort (e.g. *What did you learn today? What mistake did you make that taught you something? What did you try hard at today?*)
- Model this yourself as you share about your day

## January Focus

Our January Focus for PBS is Participation. Participation is not only about raising your hand in class or joining school extracurricular activities, it is about being an active participant in your own learning and demonstrating a "can-do" attitude or what is called a growth mindset.

We are encouraging families (new JK/SK students only) to **pre-register** online at [www.lkdsb.net/kindergarten](http://www.lkdsb.net/kindergarten) **and** to attend on Thursday, February 28th.

KinderSTART is a special one-day event for parents and guardians to register their child(ren) for Kindergarten. Through KinderSTART children and parents/guardians have an early opportunity to visit the school, meet some of our FDK staff and learn more about FDK in preparation for school in the fall of 2019. Items required: Please bring a printed copy of the completed registration form, original documentation showing proof of age for the child(ren) being registered and current address (utility or tax bill). Note: These items must be presented at the time of registration.

Junior Kindergarten – Children, four years of age on or before December 31, 2019 may be registered for classes beginning September, 2019.

It is important that parents register their children at this time to allow schools to plan class sizes. It is not necessary to re-register for Senior Kindergarten if your child is presently attending JK at Errol Road Public School.

### Secondary School Visits – Gr 7/8 Students and Parents Grade 9 Options Sheets Open House/Information Nights

The start of the year is an excellent time to assess and set new academic goals. This is especially true for Grade 8 students as they make plans for Grade 9 and the transition to Secondary School. Errol Road students, depending on where they live, may attend either Northern Collegiate Institute and Vocational School or Great Lakes Secondary School or Alexander Mackenzie Secondary School.

On Tuesday, January 15<sup>th</sup>, Grade 8 students will listen to a presentation at Errol Road Public School from Student Services staff from both N.C.I.V.S. At that time, students will be given an option sheet to take home and fill out in consultation with their parent/guardians for their upcoming September 2018, Grade 9 courses.

### Cold, Snowy Winter Weather

Please make sure that your children come dressed warmly for the cold weather as they go outside for fresh air and play at all recesses, unless the wind chill is greater than -18 at which time they remain inside for recess. It is important for students to wear a hat, mitts, boots and snow pants to school. Please do not send your child to school wearing a scarf as they can be a safety hazard on the school yard. Students who wish to play in the snow need to be dressed appropriately. It is also a good idea to keep a spare pair of mitts and socks in the backpack in case one set gets wet while playing.

### Play Ground – Safety

Due to winter conditions, school playground equipment is “off limits” during the winter season. Students are not to play on the equipment at any time, including before and after school.

### Bus Students

Please be aware that the **bus zone for Errol Road is Zone 2**. Some students may also be picked up from other zones in close proximity to Zone 2. To stay up to date with any changes in bussing, download the MySBI mobile app. It will send you instant notifications of school bus delays, and cancellations. Just download the free app from Android/Apple app stores, and subscribe to Weather Notifications, as well as to your child's school bus name.
