## **Tracking Achievement**

Many of you will know that the Ontario curriculum documents are publicly available. <u>In fact, they can be found</u> <u>here.</u> An interesting aspect of the Ontario curriculum documents is a resource called the Achievement Chart. These charts are common frameworks comprised of consistent provincial performance standards for each subject/discipline. Educators use these charts in many ways including to help plan learning tasks and to inform their assessment/evaluation of student learning.

The Achievement Chart is comprised of four categories that reminds us that learning doesn't always have to come in the form of students acquiring specific knowledge. The four categories are Knowledge and Understanding, Thinking, Communication, and Application.

As shared in previous newsletters, the document that we use provincially to guide our assessment and evaluation practices in Ontario schools is called <u>Growing Success</u>.

# **Daily COVID Screener and Confirmation**

The Ministry of Education has directed all elementary and secondary students to confirm they have completed the Ontario COVID-19 School and Child Care Screening.

The Ontario COVID-19 School and Child Care Screening is available here: https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/

There are two different procedures: 1) <u>Kindergarten to Grade 3 Students</u>

Parents/Guardians of Kindergarten - Grade 3 students will confirm the completion of the COVID-19 screener in one of the following ways:

• respond to the automated email sent in the morning

• confirming with the school office staff by emailing Ms. Boersma at carolin.boersma@lkdsb.net Following the morning attendance, school office staff will contact parents/guardians of students who are present and have NOT confirmed completion of the screening.

#### 2) Grade 4 to Grade 8 Students

The teacher will confirm with the student that they have completed the Ontario COVID-19 School and Child Care Screening that day. If a student has not completed the screener, they are to complete the screener. Regular safety protocols will remain in place for students who exhibit Covid-19 symptoms once at school.

#### **Before School on the Yard**

We've received direction that beginning March 7 students will remain outside on the school yard prior to the bell before the school day begins. For parents/guardians, there should not be a noticeable difference for them during morning drop-off. For students, this means that they will spend the times between 8:50 – 9:05 out on the yard. We will have supervision available on both sides of the yard during that time each day. As always, for the safety of our students, please remember that <u>supervision at the school is not available until 8:50</u> and students dropped of at the school before that time will not have access to supervision.

#### Hand Hygiene

Hand hygiene is explicitly taught by our staff and is very important to maintain a healthy child. Before transitioning to other activities, removal of face coverings, using learning tools, eating lunch, and using technology, etc., students are encouraged to either wash their hands at the sink or use the school-provided hand sanitizer. Signage and stations have been added to the school. Wall pumps for sanitizers have been installed throughout the school.

Here is a <u>helpful video</u> that we use during our morning announcements to remind us about the importance of hand hygiene.

#### **Daily Student Absences and Telephone Usage**

We have a telephone answering service, therefore if your child is or will be absent, please call the school and leave a message. This assists us as we need to contact the parents of all absent students as part of our Safe Arrival Policy each day. The answering service can be accessed 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

To decrease the amount of office/class interruptions and phone calls home for students, we request that students take time at home to ensure they have what they need to be adequately prepared for classes. Lunches, books, projects, supplies, etc. should accompany the students when they leave for school each day. This is vitally important during our COVID-19 guidelines as visitors are not expected at the school during the day. We do appreciate your cooperation and support in preparing your child(ren) to become responsible citizens.

## End of Day Dismissal

When alternate arrangements are made by families for dismissal times, we please ask that you notify the office. This will ensure that the message is communicated so staff and student are aware of the change.

## **Bus Students/Inclement Weather**

The Board's Transportation Department has placed schools in geographic zones. **Errol Village Public School is located in ZONE 1.
