# **Supervision Before School**

Please know that staff are not available to supervise students on the yard until 8:50 each morning. For the safety of our students, we please ask that students do not arrive to the school's property before 8:50 a.m.

# **Daily Student Absences**

Families can use School Messenger or our telephone answering service to report if a child is or will be absent. This assists us as we need to contact the parents of all absent students as part of our Safe Arrival Policy each day. The answering service can be accessed 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

To decrease the amount of office/class interruptions and phone calls home from students, we request that students take time at home to ensure they have what they need to be adequately prepared for classes. Lunches, books, projects, supplies, etc. should accompany the students when they leave for school each day.

#### **Bus Application - MySBI**

There is an upgraded version available of the application used to monitor weather cancellations and bus delays. Unfortunately, the app currently installed on phones will NOT automatically update to the new version, so all users must download the new app from the App/Google Play Store before September 29<sup>th</sup> to continue receiving school bus delay and cancellation notices. The current 'old' version of the app will no longer function after this date. You can click on this link if you need instructions to update this app.

# **Plans of Care**

To promote the safety and well-being of students, the Ministry of Education requires all school boards in Ontario to develop and maintain a policy or policies to support students in schools who have asthma, diabetes, and/or epilepsy, and/or are at risk for anaphylaxis. Parents/guardians are expected to inform the school of their child's medical condition(s) and, in turn, we will co-create a Plan of Care including emergency response for their child.

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# **Verification Forms**

During the first week of school, we will be sending home some forms used to verify and update important information. Please keep an eye out for this paperwork to come home. Once signed, please send it back to the school. These documents allow us to have the most current and accurate information.

If you've ever considered hosting an international student in your home, now is the time to apply!

International high-school students from Australia, Belgium, China, Colombia, France, Germany, Spain, Italy, and Taiwan are excited to come to the Lambton Kent District School Board (LKDSB) for our great education programs and dynamic outdoor life.

Homestay host families are needed for placements across the LKDSB, particularly in Petrolia, Forest, and Sarnia. Urgently needed are placements for male students. Hosts receive a generous allowance (\$850/month) to offset expenses, 24/7 support, and special health and safety training.

When you host international students your family benefits with lifelong friendships, global awareness, and stronger interpersonal skills. Children in families who host international students learn to meet inter-cultural challenges with open minds and learn to advocate for people who may be vulnerable.
