February is Black History Month

Within the LKDSB, the Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Justice team is supporting staff in continued commitment to including Black experiences, perspectives, heritage, and futures throughout the curriculum and throughout the school year. This includes school specific announcements which feature past and present local individuals that are of historical significance. The LKDSB has invited local Black historic sites to join in an online presentation that all classes will tune into towards the end of the month, durng our Black History Month initiative this year. We are thankful for the work of the Josiah Henson Museum of African-Canadian History, the Buxton National Historic Site & Museum, and the Black Mecca Museum for their involvement. We are very proud of the local Black history and perspectives that will be woven into this celebration.

Student Attendance

Student academic and social success is directly connected to regular attendance at school. While we understand that students will encounter some illness over the course of the year, and we certainly want students to be home when they are unwell, having students at school, on time, as regularly as possible is our goal. Part of the School Improvement Goal, which is required by the LKDSB program department, the school team develops a set of goals each fall and works continually at those goals over the course of the year. Improving student attendance and putting support into place to help students attend more regularly and on time continues to be something our whole staff is working towards. You may have had contact with your child(ren)'s teacher when your child has been absent, asking about the well-being of your child and seeing if there was anything that our school team could help with to get them back to school without further delay. This is part of our School Improvement Goal. Additionally, for some students with a high number of absences or late arrivals, a letter expressing the concerns and next steps will be coming home with the Term 1 Report Cards/Communication of Learning, on February 16th.

<u>Term One ends, Term Two begins</u>

The official end of Term One occurs on February 1st which is followed by a Professional Activity Day on February 2nd where staff are working on finishing the Provincial Report Cards for Grade 1 through 8 and the Communication of Learning for JK and SK students. This means that Term Two begins on February 5th and will run through June 27th. Term One report cards and Communication or Learning will come home on Friday, February 16th. After receiving that important document, you may have questions for one or more of your child's educators. Please reach out to them directly and ask questions about the information contained and how you might be able to assist your learner with home support.

Gracious donation and huge "Thank you"

Our Grade 8 students typically take on a large amount of fundraising to make their three-day field trip toward the end of the year affordable. This year, the teaching staff appealed to community groups to determine if there might be some financial support to assist with this large endeavor. As we returned to school after the winter holiday break, we were delighted to have received a substantial financial donation. Vaccination Records with CKPHU

Parents and guardians have the responsibility to report their child's vaccinations to the Chatham Kent Public Health Unit, as part of ensuring that all school aged children are up to date on their vaccinations. If this process is not completed, students' risk being suspended from attending school effective March 5th, 2024. To avoid this headache and give families plenty of time to report the vaccinations which have already taken place, or to schedule to receive the vaccinations in time, information is being shared with all parents and guardians now. Our school has been working with Board level personnel to learn about effective ways to support our students who have brought this idea forward to our staff. We would like to thank Mme. Woods, Mme. Ryall and M. Durepos for volunteering to facilitate this school activity. The club will meet weekly during lunch and recess, for 40 minutes. This opportunity aligns with the LKDSB's Strategic Priorities, specifically related to Inclusive Diversity – Champion Anti-Oppressive Education. Pediculosis (Head Lice)

Head lice is a nuisance and difficult to deal with both at school and at home. Periodically throughout the year, typically following a break, the staff will perform head checks to ensure that no students have either live head lice or the nits that lead to live head lice. We ask that parents routinely check their children for head lice. If your child happens to be affected by this nuisance, please inform the office and we will help you with the next steps. Following the notification to the office, our staff will perform those classroom checks to make sure there are no other students in the class affected. Correspondence will be sent from the office if there is a case within the class that you need to be made aware of and then continue to monitor your child(ren). We certainly appreciate the cooperation that we have from our families at home.
