Spring is arriving soon

You will have seen and heard about the upcoming Total Solar Eclipse which is happening on Monday, April 8th. Where we live, attend school and work, is within a direct path of the eclipse. Many factors played a part in the LKDSB determining that there would be a change in the academic calendar which would make Monday, April 8th a PA Day, which is shifted from Friday, April 26th. This means that on Monday, April 8th, students will be at home with their parents or in the care of someone other than the school to safely observe the solar eclipse. On Friday, April 26th, school will function as a regular school day.

Pediculosis (Head Lice)

Head lice is a nuisance and difficult to deal with both at school and at home. Periodically throughout the year, typically following a break, the staff will perform head checks to ensure that no students have either live head lice or the nits that lead to live head lice. We ask that parents routinely check their children for head lice. If your child happens to be affected by this nuisance, please inform the office and we will help you with the next steps. Following the notification to the office, our staff will perform those classroom checks to make sure there are no other students in the class affected. Correspondence will be sent from the office if there is a case within the class that you need to be made aware of and then continue to monitor your child(ren). We certainly appreciate the cooperation that we have from our families at home.

Safe Travel To and From School

With the nicer weather upon us, more students and families are choosing to travel to school by walking, riding bikes or scooters, or rollerblades. While this is a great way to get exercise before or after school, it brings some additional risks travelling in the community. We are reminding students and parents to work together to determine which route is the safest to take, and to use municipal crosswalks at intersections, including crosswalks which are activated by pedestrians.

We would also like to remind you that supervision on the school yard begins each morning at 9:00AM and that students shouldn't be arriving by any method prior to that time. If students arrive by vehicle, they need to remain in the vehicle with their caregiver until the opening bell rings at 9:00AM. We want to make sure that each student is arriving to and departing from school safely and we thank you for your cooperation in this effort.

Vaccination Records with CKPHU

Parents and guardians have the responsibility to report their child's vaccinations to the Chatham Kent Public Health Unit, as part of ensuring that all school aged children are up to date on their vaccinations. If this process is not completed, students' risk being suspended from attending school effective March 5th, 2024. To avoid this headache and give families plenty of time to report the vaccinations which have already taken place, or to schedule to receive the vaccinations in time, information is being shared with all parents and guardians now. Dental Screening

On Tuesday, March 26th, the Chatham-Kent Public Health Unit will be at the school to conduct dental screenings for students in JK, SK, Grade 2 and Grade 8, as well as any students whose parents would like them screened. Information was sent home electronically on February 22nd with all students in the school to help parents understand this process. If your child is not within the group that has planned screenings and you feel this is something that you would like to happen on March 26th, please contact the school office and have your child(ren)'s names added to the list of those who will be screened that day.

IEPs and Universal Supports

Families of students with Individual Education Plans (IEP) will receive proposed updated plans on or before March 22nd. This is an important part of the school year. As students with the greatest learning needs are prioritized, undoubtedly every student receives what they need. Often accommodations found on IEPs are great universal supports for all learners. As educators strive to make the accommodations on IEPs come alive, students without IEPs benefit from these universally beneficial learning accommodations as they are just great teaching practices. Every learner has unique needs. Even if your child doesn't have an IEP, consider contacting your child(ren)'s teacher(s) to discuss your child(ren)'s unique learning needs and how they are being

met in the classroom. Consider providing insight into things you have discovered about your child while learning with them in your home. Remember, you are always the expert on your child, and we become better at supporting your child as deep, rich conversations between home and school take place.
