Student Pick Up/Drop Off

Drivers are asked to take extra care when driving along Lawrence Ave. and on school property. We have many children walking to and from school and they are not always as "traffic safe" as we'd like.

Please refrain from parking in the bus loading area in front of the school.

There are no crossing guards or Safety Patrollers at any of our school crossings. We ask that parents reinforce good walking habits with their children and that any parents who are driving take extra care around our school crossings.

For students being dropped off/picked up, families are asked to do so at the school yard gates. Thank you.

Truth and Reconciliation

We are committed to fulfilling the Calls to Action as put out by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission as they apply to the school setting. In order to increase the awareness of the legacy of the Residential School System, acknowledge its' impact and begin on the path to reconciliation, we will once again wear our Orange Shirts every Thursday this year.

We encourage all of our students to do the same and if you aren't sure why the orange shirt is so important, please talk with your child as we'll be learning about Orange Shirt Day all this month.





Student Absences

Due to Safe School policies, the school is required to contact all families of students who are absent without prior notice. If you know your child is going to be away, for any reason, please report it on the School Messenger app that was introduced last year. If you require instructions on how to find or use the School Messenger app, please let the office know and we'll send an instruction page home.

NUT Aware School

Please note that we have students in our school who have anaphylactic allergies to peanuts, ground nuts and tree nuts. As these students are in various grades within the school, the following applies to all of our classrooms and students. In order to keep these students safe while at school, we ask for your cooperation in the following:

Do not send in food that contains peanuts, ground nuts or tree nuts or their oils – this includes (but is not limited to) peanut butter, other nut butters, WOW butter and Nutella. Ensure that any prepackaged snacks that may contain nuts (cookies, granola bars, candy bars) are labelled as Nut Safe or School Safe.

- ·Encourage your child to wash their hands before and after eating, or use hand sanitizer.
- Do not send in baked goods for class treats or parties all food entering the school needs to be commercially made and packaged and labelled Nut Safe or School Safe and come from a Nut Free facility (ie. Maple City Bakery)
- ·Encourage your child to never trade or share food at school

If you have any questions or concerns about our policies on anaphylaxis, please contact your child's teacher or the main office.



Our Daily Schedule

Our instructional day begins at 09:10am and goes until 3:30pm. We have two breaks throughout the day - the first half of the break is outdoor play (20 minutes) and the second half is our nutritional break (20 minutes). These breaks occur from 11:10-11:50 and 1:30-2:10 daily.

Supervision on the yard begins at 8:55 - please do not have students arriving before this time.



School Cash Online

SchoolCashOnline is available for families and once again, families are able to pay by credit card or similar cards, like Visa Debit. The program does not store your banking or credit card information, so you will need to enter it each time. If you have not already signed up, visit our school website and sign up today. You will need a student number when signing up, so please call the school to obtain that information if you need it.



School Council/Home & School Association

The first meeting of the year will be on Monday, October 2nd at 6:00 pm at the school. Each parent must be nominated in writing; please contact the office for nomination forms. If you can't fill one out ahead of time, we will have some sent home after the meeting. We will elect our Chair at this meeting, as well as solicit a volunteer to act as recording secretary.

The School Council acts as an advisory group for the Principal of the school – they advise the school with community input and in turn, take information from the school to the community at large.

The Home and School Association is a group of parent volunteers focusing on fundraising for related school items or events. Last year, the Home and School helped with field trips, our Spring Banquet and our new sound system. We are always looking for new families to join as many hands make light work. The first meeting will be held in conjunction with School Council.


Medications & Medical Plans of Care

If your child requires prescription medication to be administered throughout the school day, an "Authorization to Administer Oral Medication" form will need to be completed and signed by both the parent and a doctor/nurse practitioner. This form then needs to be returned to the Principal and will be kept on file for the full year. School staff are unable to administer any prescription medication unless this form is complete and on file at the school. Administration of non-prescription medication still requires an Authorization form to be completed but does NOT require a doctor/nurse practitioner's signature. Please contact the office to obtain this form as needed.

Any students who have been diagnosed with diabetes, anaphylactic allergies, epilepsy or any other medical condition that might require medical attention will need to complete an "Individual Medical Emergency Plan".

Pediculosis (Head Lice)

Sometimes students arrive at school infected with pediculosis or head lice. Finding this early really helps to stop the spread and your help in this is greatly appreciated. Please check your child for head lice weekly. If you find evidence of head lice, please let the school know. This will allow us to notify other parents in the classrooms affected so that they may check their child(ren). Children who are suspected of having head lice will be excused until appropriate treatment has been administered. Infestation by head lice is an unpleasant nuisance, but not a health problem. Head lice do not carry or spread disease.





Bus Information

During the fall we might experience some heavy fog in which there could be the potential for bus cancellations. When there are bus cancellations due to fog, buses will not run in the morning but will run in the afternoon. H.W. Burgess is in BUS ZONE 7.

Registration Verification

A Registration Verification form will be sent home with each child in the coming days. We ask that you review this form and note any necessary changes. If no changes are necessary, please confirm your consent at the bottom of the form for your child with regard to LKDSB media (see below) and return these signed forms to the school as soon as possible.

Throughout the school year, many school activities occur and may be the subject of photographing, audio-taping, videotaping and filming. In accordance with the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, a signed release is required for the photographing or filming of student participation in these activities. In addition, the public media organization, upon notification, may be present to cover events by videotaping and filming students involved in activities which are outside of the jurisdiction of the School and/or Board.

Refillable Water Bottles

We are fortunate that our school is equipped with two refillable water bottle stations. We kindly ask that you send your students with refillable water bottles. As environmental stewards, our goal is to reduce single use plastics as much as possible. Thank you for your support!



Community VTRA - Violent Threat Risk Assessment Protocol

The Lambton Kent District School Board is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors, and community members. When a student behaves inappropriately, principals will most often employ progressive discipline strategies to help a student take responsibility for their actions, learn from their mistakes, and make better choices in the future. In more extreme cases however, when a student's behaviour poses a potential threat to their own or others' well-being, the Community Violence Threat Risk Assessment Protocol (VTRA) supports principals in taking further steps to safeguard everyone. The VTRA protocol outlines how a school responds immediately to threatening incidents including but not limited to possession of weapons or replica weapons, bomb threat or plan, verbal or written (including electronic) threats to harm oneself or others, other threats of violence, and fire setting. The initial response team is likely to include the Principal/Vice Principal, police, and board staff. Should conditions warrant, a Community Threat Assessment team will be convened. This community team includes representatives of community agencies who work with schools and boards to keep our students and staff safe, such as local police and children's mental health organizations. Parents and guardians will be notified if their child will be discussed through the Community Violence Threat Risk Assessment Protocol. If parents/guardians cannot be reached, or if they choose not to provide consent, but a concern for safety still exists due to threatening behaviour, the threat assessment may still proceed.
