
Character @ King George VI

Angela Duckworth's book, <u>Grit: The Power of Passion and Perseverance</u>, outlines years of research suggesting that grit is a stronger predictor of high achievement than



intelligence or talent. By fostering a strong sense of belief in oneself, a growth mindset, and encouraging children to push through obstacles and persevere, they will be well-positioned to learn from mistakes, overcome barriers, and reach their goals in spite of setbacks.
