### **STUDENT PLACEMENTS**

### **SAFE DROP-OFF & PICK-UP**

Safe drop-off in the morning (8:25-8:40)

- Double check the information communicated home to confirm which door your child will enter the school.
- This is the SAME door they will exit at the end of the day.

Safe pick-up at the end of the day (3:00)

Students will exit the same door they entered in the morning.

#### **Late Arrivals**

All late arrivals are asked to enter through the school's main doors and report directly to the office.

### **REGISTRATION VERIFICATION FORMS**

Registration Verification Forms will be sent home with students at the beginning of the school year. The office must have updated contact information in case of an emergency, so your assistance in the speedy return of these forms is greatly appreciated. Communication through email will be ongoing, and having the most up-to-date email address will ensure that you are receiving the most recent school updates. An essential aspect of the verification form is the medical information and allergies section the school needs to know about your child(ren). Please inform us of any medical/allergy information changes.

### **ALLERGIES**

Many children and staff members have severe allergies to peanuts, peanut butter, and other nuts. We ask for your help as a caring and responsible school community member. Please do not send your child with any nuts or peanut butter. Allergies and sensitivities to fragrances can have severe health implications. We ask that scented products and scented school supplies not be brought into the school.

#### PREVALENT MEDICAL CONDITIONS

Please notify the office immediately if your child has a prevalent medical condition (i.e., Asthma, Epilepsy, Anaphylactic to nuts or bees, Diabetes).

#### **CONSENT FOR AUTHORIZATION OF MEDICATION**

If a student must take medication at school, Board policy requires us to have a Medical Physician complete a consent form. Please request the blank form from our school secretary. Students should place any medication in the teacher's hands when they arrive at school.

#### **APPENDIX B: Permission for the use of Student Personal Information**

Throughout the school year, we may photograph, audiotape, or videotape students involved in activities and recognize their achievements in school/classroom newsletters, our school website, school Facebook, etc. In addition, the newspaper or local media may be present to cover certain events. #### **BUS INFORMATION/MySBI - BUS STATUS APP**

Getting information about school bus cancellations and delays is easy! CLASS has a mobile app that will give subscribers real-time notifications whenever buses are delayed by ten minutes. The notifications will come in the form of alerts, including service cancellations due to adverse weather conditions. There has been a new upgraded version of our MySBI app. All existing users must download the new app to continue receiving school bus notifications.

Queen Elizabeth II Public School-Sarnia is in Bus Zone #2 for bussing and weather information. If you choose to drive your child/children to school when the buses are cancelled due to inclement weather, you will need to pick them up at the end of the school day at 3:00 p.m.

### SCHOOL MESSENGER ATTENDANCE REPORTING

At the Lambton Kent District School Board, one of our most significant priorities is ensuring students arrive safely at school every day. You may have received a notification about your child's absence from our School Messenger automated attendance messaging system. We have now added a School Messenger Parent/Guardian Reporting Tool for you to notify the school about your child's absence.

Parents/guardians can use School Messenger in one of the following three ways to report your child's absence:

- Option 1: Call a toll-free number and follow the prompts.
- Option 2: Set up a secure online School Messenger account and log in to a website.
- Option 3: Download and set up the School Messenger app (Apple or Android) on a smartphone or tablet.

### **SCHOOL CASH ONLINE**

School Cash Online is an easy-to-use and safe way to pay your children's school fees. Now, with a few clicks, you can pay for your child's yearbook, class trips, and much more from your home. All you have to do is register an account, attach your children, include their student numbers (which can be found on the Student Verification Form), and in no time, you will be able to make payments online. ## **ORANGE SHIRT DAY**

The Lambton Kent District School Board will commemorate the impact of residential schools on **Friday, September 29**<sup>th</sup>, **2023** – Orange Shirt Day. Students and staff are encouraged to wear orange shirts and use this day as a catalyst to encourage learning and understanding about the residential school system and the impacts that system has had on First Nations, Metis and Inuit people. This is a meaningful way as school communities to come together in a spirit of reconciliation and hope because "Every Child Matters".

In honouring and remembering those impacted by residential schools, LKDSB had commissioned a new orange shirt design in 2021. Orange shirts are available to order by interested families. ### **SCHOOL FOUNTAINS AND FILLING STATIONS**

All our drinking fountains and filling stations are in working order. These devices continue to be flushed as per routine water flushing procedures. Students are encouraged to bring refillable bottles to school.

### PEDICULOSIS (HEAD LICE)

Fall is one season when head lice (pediculosis) cases are most prevalent. Your assistance in early detection is greatly appreciated. Please check your child for head lice and nits weekly. Please contact the school immediately if you find evidence of head lice and nits. This will allow us to confidentially notify other parents/guardians in the classroom(s) affected so that they may check their child and help to limit the spread. Children suspected of having head lice and nits will be excused until appropriate treatment has been administered. Head lice and nits infestation is an unpleasant nuisance but not a health problem. By working together, we can help control the spread of head lice in our community.
