NATIONAL INDIGENOUS HISTORY MONTH

June is National Indigenous History Month and a time for all Canadians to reflect upon and learn the history, sacrifices, cultures, contributions, and strength of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people. LKDSB will be recognizing June 21 as National Indigenous Peoples Day. On this day and throughout the year, we honour the history, heritage, and diversity of Indigenous peoples in Canada. We invite students and staff to participate

in an Orange Shirt Day. Students and staff are encouraged to wear orange to honour the survivors of residential schools, as well as those children and young people who never returned home. The LKDSB believes student success is achieved through the shared responsibility of students, staff, families, community, and Indigenous partners.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration continues for students who are new to our FDK program! Students who are currently attending Rosedale in year 1 (junior kindergarten) or year 2 (senior kindergarten) do not need to re-register. Registering your child for kindergarten is as easy as 1, 2, 3.

1. Find your school.
2. Complete the online registration form @ www.lkdsb.net/kindergarten in advance.
3. Our office staff will contact you to set up an appointment to come in and complete the paperwork. Please remember to bring:
 - Birth certificate or proof of Canadian Citizenship or Residency Status (if appropriate)
 - Proof of residency (e.g., utility or tax bill, lease/rental agreement, etc.)
