


Emergency Response Drills

I am grateful for the water that we drink, the food we eat, the shelter that we have, the sun that makes us warm, the clothes that we wear and the people we live with. The commitments that we can make to the land include not littering, recycling items, being kind to the land by looking after nature and teaching other people to respect the land. We can support the Ojibwe and Anishinaabe people by learning about their culture and supporting their initiatives like fighting for clean drinking water and protecting the environment. It is our responsibility to care for all people and the environment."
