Being involved in your children's school is a great way to stay connected. Meetings are monthly and are held at the school. The next meeting is October 11th @ 6pm. Please come to the front doors and you will be directed to the correct room. Please contact the office if you would like to attend but require childcare.

BUSSING AND INCLEMENT WEATHER

The Board's Transportation Department has placed schools in geographic zones. Rosedale is in ZONE 2. When listening for cancellation of buses for fog/snow the zones will be announced for our students. Download the MySBI 4 mobile app for your bus information. When logging into the parent portal and reviewing bus pick up and drop off times, please be sure to click on "contacts" and scroll down to look at the seat assignment for those in your family riding the

bus as CLASS has assigned seats again this year. Please visit https://cklass.ca/services/student-transportation/ for updated information. We take attendance on the bus every afternoon. If your child will not be riding the bus, please send a note or make a phone call for that day prior to dismissal time. If your child is registered for the bus, the expectation is that they will be on the bus. Students will not be permitted to walk home without previous parent/guardian approval. You can choose to decline transportation should you be consistently picking up your child.

MOBILE DEVICES

While we understand that many families use mobile devices to communicate, it is important to communicate the reality at school - for the most part, personal mobile devices are a significant distraction in the classroom. It is the feeling of the Ministry of Education and the feeling of our staff that instructional time should be focused on learning and not on social media. In 2019, the Ministry of Education updated the Provincial Code of Conduct restricting the use of cell phones and other personal mobile devices. Rosedale's policy is consistent with this change. In short, during instructional time, students may not use their personal mobile device unless it is required for health/medical purposes, it is used to support special education needs, or its use has been directed by an educator for educational purposes. If your child regularly brings a cellphone or other personal mobile device to school on a regular basis, we ask that you review this messaging with them.
