Welcome to 2024!

January is a time of great beginnings and the best one is the beginning of school! We are excited to welcome our newest Falcons to the nest at Kindergarten Registration. If you have a child born in 2020 (or born in 2019 and not yet attending school) or know of one, please see below for Registration times/dates.

Kindergarten Registration

Registering your child for Kindergarten is as easy as 1, 2, 3.

- 1. Find your school.
- 2. Complete the online registration form at LKDSB Kindergarten Registration in advance.
- 3. Come and meet our caring staff on:

Thursday, Feb. 1, 2024, from 4:00pm – 7:00pm or Friday, Feb. 2, 2024, from 9:00am – 3:00pm.

Remember to bring:

- Birth certificate or proof of Canadian Citizenship or Residency Status (if appropriate)
- Proof of residency (e.g., utility or tax bill, lease/rental agreement, etc.)
- Your child

School Immunizations

Unless they have a valid exemption on file with CK Public Health, all children who attend school in Ontario must be vaccinated against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, meningitis, whooping cough and chickenpox.

Families are asked to provide proof of vaccination to the CK Public Health Unit. Reporting can be done online (<u>Chatham-Kent Public Health Immunization Reporting</u>), phone (519-355-1071 Ext. 5900), or by fax (519-436-3214).

Note that doctor's offices do not forward immunization information to Public Health and if you have moved from another Public Health Unit, they will not forward information to CKPH. Families are responsible for updating CKPH themselves.

Students who have not provided CKPH with either proof of vaccination or a valid exemption by <u>March 5th</u>, will be suspended from attending school by the CKPH.

Winter Dress

With the ever-changing weather, please ensure that your children are dressed appropriately for the conditions. Hats, boots, mittens and warm coats are needed this time of year. This is also a great time of year to wear layers so that children can adjust their clothing as the temperature warms throughout the day.

We have a limited amount of spare clothing and coats here at school for students to access if they've forgotten something at home.

Students are outside multiple times during the day and we'd like them to be as comfortable as possible.

Hot Lunches

Hot lunches continue to be a great success and a time saver for many families. As we move forward through the year, the plan is to offer the following:

- Pizza (Fridays)- orders sent out for 2-3 months at a time
- Harvest Fresh (Tuesdays) also sent out 2 months at a time
- Subway each month we'll offer an opportunity to purchase sandwiches from Subway

Money raised through hot lunch sales goes into the Student Trust Fund, which is used to subsidize field trips, contribute to Grade 8 Graduation and purchase equipment for student use.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Students should not be dropped off before 9:00 in the morning, as the yard is unsupervised until that time. As well, please encourage your children to head straight home after school instead of playing at the school or park.

If you need to pick your child up early, please let the office know. Our attendance phone line is active 24 hours a day and you are welcome to leave a message on it at any time. We ask that parents avoid picking up their children between 3:15-3:35 as the school is very busy at that time and to ensure the safety of every student, we need to be able to account for everyone.

Playground Equipment

A reminder that all playground equipment (climbers, monkey bars, GaGa Ball pit) is closed for the season. We ask families to help us to enforce this by encouraging your child(ren) to stay off the equipment before and after school, until it reopens in the spring.

Bus Cancellations – Zone 7

During the fall we might experience some heavy fog in which there could be the potential for bus cancellations. During the fall season, when there are bus cancellations due to fog, busses will not run in the morning but will run in the afternoon.

To check for any bus cancellations during the school year, please tune into the local radio stations or check the school's social media feeds.

COVID Protocols

Currently, the LKDSB continues to take direction from and follow the advice of the CK Medical Officer of Health, the Ministry of Health, and the Ministry of Education.

While many protocols and guidelines have eased up, we are still encouraging families to do the following to keep our building and our people as safe as can be:

- Stay home if feeling sick (to determine when to return to school, feel free to continue to use the School Screener for guidance - <u>Covid School Screener</u>)
