Inclement Weather

As we experience winter weather conditions, it is important to understand the school board's policies regarding inclement weather.

Our school is in <u>Zone 8</u>. If buses are cancelled in Zone 8 due to road conditions, they will not pick up or drop off children. The school is open even when buses are cancelled, unless otherwise stated. On days when buses are cancelled, academic programming will continue as normal. If your child is not a bus student, they are expected to be at school. If they are not able to attend, please contact the office at 519-352-4530, so that we know they are safe.

Winter Protocol

Students need to be dressed for the weather. Winter coats, hats, and gloves/mittens are safety needs for all students. With two twenty-minute blocks outside, hats and mittens help to prevent frost bite and mild hypothermia.

For safety reasons, scarves are discouraged as they present a choking/strangulation hazard. Bulky winter clothing and accessories, like scarves, can get caught in equipment.

It is important that snow stays on the ground. Throwing snowballs at school or at the bus stop is unacceptable. Reminding children of this will help keep the school day safe for everyone.

With the colder temperatures, it is also important for students to have indoor shoes at school. The floors are too cold and wet for sock feet and in the case of a fire alarm; children's feet need to be protected from the elements.

We also ask that students go home at the end of day dismissal bell and do not hang around the snow piles at school. Students should go home first and check in with an adult at home.
