Head Lice

Sometimes students arrive at school infected with pediculosis. Your assistance in early detection is greatly appreciated. Please check your child for head lice weekly. If you find evidence of head lice, please contact the school immediately. This will allow us to notify other parents in the classrooms affected, so that they may check their children. Infestation by head lice is an unpleasant nuisance, but not a health problem. Head Lice do not carry or spread disease. If we detect head lice on your child, you will be notified and asked to come to the school to pick up your child. We then ask that you use the necessary treatment on his/her hair. Your child(ren) is welcome to return to school when the pediculosis is no longer evident. Hopefully, by working together we can control the spread of head lice.
