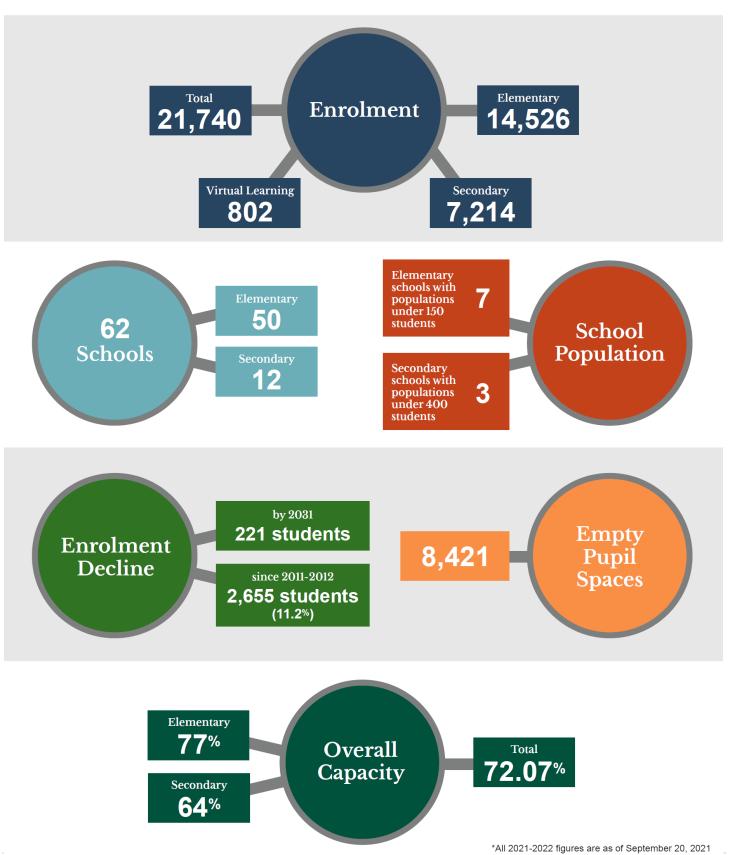

The LKDSB Pupil Accommodation Report 2021/2022 is presented to the Board in compliance with LKDSB Regulation No: R-AD-106.

The purpose of the LKDSB Pupil Accommodation Report 2021/2022 is to summarize data to provide an overview of accommodation issues across the geographic area of the Lambton Kent District School Board. The study of current student enrolment, demographic and financial data, as well as Ministry of Education initiatives, is key to future planning. Some of the data included in the <u>LKDSB Capital</u> Plan June 2021 is included in this report.

The data presented in this report indicates the LKDSB faces two ongoing challenges: demographics/declining enrolment and financial challenges (including maintaining aging facilities and excess student spaces). Due to the ongoing moratorium on school consolidations, the LKDSB is not currently permitted to move forward with its phased approach to addressing empty student spaces in its schools.

The proposed Pupil Accommodation Review Plan by Phases presented in the final pages of the report consists of four of the original 8 phases proposed to Trustees before the moratorium on Pupil Accommodation Reviews was put in the place. The first four were addressed before the moratorium was put in place and have already been or are in process of being implemented. This year's report adds some additional considerations and/or options administration would consider presenting to Trustees when the moratorium is lifted. These are based on more recent data, changing curriculum and improving student programming. The inclusion of the phases and considerations in this report does not preclude the Pupil Accommodation Review process nor imply Trustee approval of the considerations.

#### **Demographics & Current Enrolment Overview**

- LKDSB has 21,740 students as of September 20, 2021;
- o LKDSB's Ministry-rated empty pupil spaces is 8,421 as of September 20, 2021;
- o LKDSB's current capacity utilization as of September 20, 2021 is 72.07%; and
- LKDSB's projection of enrolment continues to fluctuate and capacity utilization is 22,178 students in 2025 (73.53%) and 21,911 students in 2031 (72.65%).

While Statistics Canada predicts that the birth rate in Ontario will increase from 2017 to 2027, Lambton and Chatham-Kent birth rates and the projected student population is expected to follow a neutral trend in birth rate in the LKDSB area in comparison to the province. This Statistics Canada data is supported by the Board's demographic software.

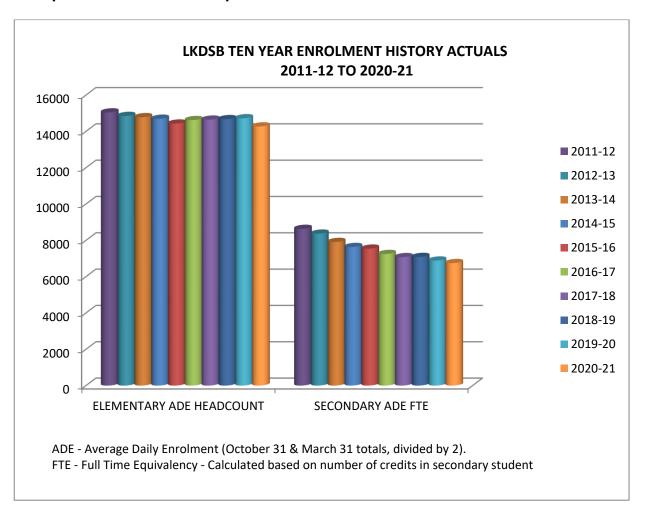
#### **LKDSB's Enrolment History**

In the 2020/2021 school year there was a 11.2% decline in overall student population compared to enrolment ten years earlier in the 2011/2012 school year as outlined in the chart below. Enrolment in the LKDSB has experienced decline since amalgamation in 1998.

In the 2020/2021 school year, our elementary enrolment decreased by 448 students over the previous school year. Secondary enrolment declined by 137 students over the previous school year. Fluctuating COVID rates throughout the year created much instability for parents and students. Many students were withdrawn from the LKDSB to be homeschooled. We have reached out to all students who were withdrawn and in the current 2021-2022 school year have seen a marked increase in those students returning to in-person learning.



#### **Current LKDSB Enrolment**

Elementary enrolment as of September 20, 2021 was 14,526 students, which represents an increase of 254 students in comparison to the 2020/21 elementary average daily enrolment (ADE) of 14,272. ADE is calculated by averaging the total enrolment on the Ministry funding dates of October 31 and March 31 of the school year. It is important to note that in the 2020/201 school year, elementary enrolment increased by 144 students on the March 31, 2021 Ministry funding date in comparison to the enrolment on October 31. Over the past three years, there has been a slight increase in elementary enrolment (average of 36 students) for the March 31 reporting date. In September 2021, additional registrants from other provinces, countries and school boards outside of the LKDSB catchment area are contributing factors to the enrolment increase, as well as students returning from home school.

As of September 20, 2021, seven elementary schools have student populations under 150 students. Those schools are: Mooretown-Courtright Public School with 93 students; Zone Township Central School with 102 students; Aberarder Public School with 105 students; Dawn-Euphemia Public School with 114 students; Riverview Central School with 136 student; Bridgeview Public School with 140 students and Thamesville Area Public School with 146 students.

Secondary enrolment as of September 20, 2021 is 7,214 students, a decrease of 257students in comparison to enrolment on October 31, 2020. Secondary enrolment is projected to fluctuate over the next 10 years as a larger elementary population moves to secondary.

As of September 20, 2021, three of twelve secondary schools have current student populations under 400. Ridgetown District High School, Grade 9-12, reports enrolment at 111 students; Blenheim District High School has 212 students; followed by Tilbury District High School with 348 students.

Note 1: Of the TDHS 348 total students, 178 are regular day school program students and 170 are attached to the ACCESS program of which approximately 40 students are enrolled in the regular day school co-op program. Other ACCESS program students are enrolled in a combination of Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL), regular day school classes and online courses.

Note 2: Lambton Kent Composite School has been removed from this sub-400 student FTE list as the Virtual Learning Program for Secondary Students has been tied to their location (BSID) for support and monitoring purposes. The regular day school in-person FTE is 256 students and the Virtual FTE student count is 366.

This enrolment data may fluctuate based on additional student admissions and/or departures that will occur between now and the first Ministry funding date of October 31, 2021. It is also important to note that not all secondary students will be funded as full-time students.

#### Summary of Current Enrolment for the 2021/22 School Year

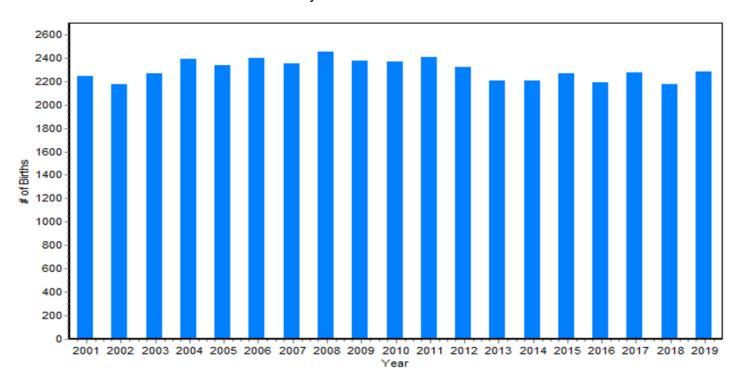
In 2020/2021, the LKDSB had 9,062 empty pupil spaces as of September 20, 2020, with a utilization rate of 69.98%.

For the 2021/22 school year, the LKDSB's total enrolment has increased from the September 20, 2020 enrolment of one year ago. As of September 20, 2021, there are 14,526 elementary students and 7,214 secondary students. The 2021/22 utilization rate of 72.07% has increased and the LKDSB has 8,421 empty pupil spaces

#### **Birth Rates**

Birth data on a Board-wide basis for the period of 2001 to 2019 illustrates a range in the number of births. The birth graph below shows a relatively stable birth rate occurred from 2004 to 2012. In 2013 and 2014, the birth rate showed a more significant decline. An increase in the birth rate was experienced in 2015 and 2017 and 2019. However, the decline continued in 2016 and 2018 with the number in 2018 marking the lowest on record since the year 2000.

Births by LKDSB Catchment Area



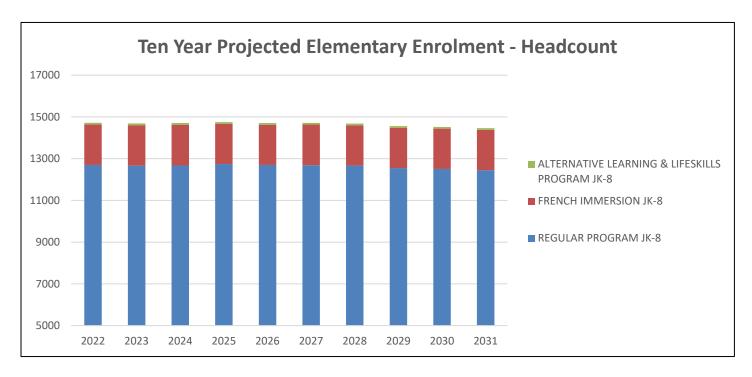
Data sources used by the Board's planning software to determine the birth rate include the Provincial Birth Registry, Canada Child Benefit information, and available Census data.

The 2016 Census data supports that there are more women in the 25-34 key age group living in the LKDSB catchment area in 2016. However, the number of births per woman has decreased from an average of 0.198 in 2011 to 0.18 in 2016, resulting in fewer overall births. The Birth assumptions made in this projection reflects 2-year average and includes a neutral trend.

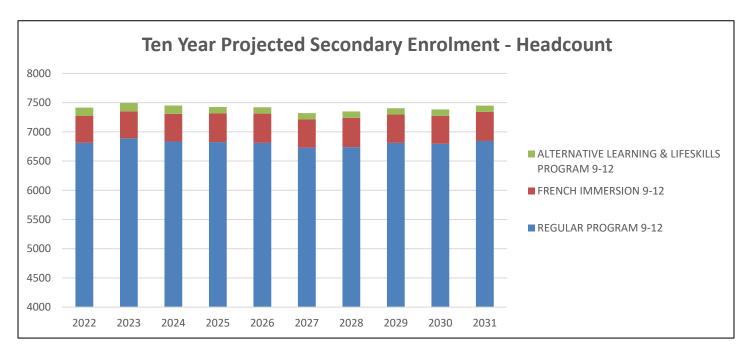

#### **LKDSB Projected Enrolment**

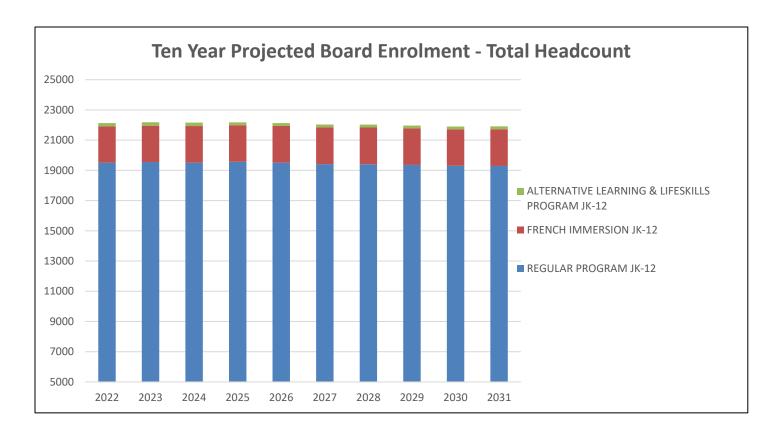
Over the long term the elementary headcount is projected to continue to decline, but at a slower pace than was anticipated. In 2022, a high of 14,717 elementary aged students is projected. Ten years later, in 2031, the elementary enrolment projection is 14,461, a decline of 256 students. This projection would result in an average of twenty-five less elementary students per year over the next ten years.



Secondary enrolment (under 21) is projected to fluctuate over the next ten years, due to larger elementary class moves to secondary. In 2031, an estimated headcount of 7,450 is projected, resulting in an increase of 35 students over the 2022 projection of 7,415 total students. This includes projected student participation in the International Education Program. It is important to note that with secondary enrolment, not all students in this headcount will be funded as full-time students.



Overall student enrolment in the LKDSB is projected to continue to decline, as outlined in the Projected Board Enrolment chart below.



By 2031, projections indicate that the overall LKDSB enrolment is expected to decline by approximately 221 students.

- Enrolment for JK-Grade 8 is projected to decrease by 256 students
- Enrolment for Grades 9-12 is projected to increase slightly by 35 students
- Ministry-rated empty pupil spaces will be 8,250
- Capacity Utilization will be 72.65%

This figure includes approximately 170 students who are enrolled in the A.C.C.E.S.S. (Acquiring Current Curriculum Experience through Supervised Studies) Program at TDHS. This program supports students, primarily from low-German Mennonite families involved in seasonal work, in pursuing academic goals and achieving their O.S.S.D.

#### NB.

- a) The COIVD-19 Pandemic created numerous conditions for the past year of 2020-2021 that impacted on the ability of the LKDSB to set current standard headcount numbers for schools. Factors included: a move to quad-mestering of courses in the Secondary Schools, large numbers of students and parents opting for a Virtual Learning placement, and there being multiple set periods for students to migrate between virtual and in-person learning environments.
- b) Due to parent concerns for student safety, there was a marked increase in the number of requests for home schooling. This trend lessened in the current 2021-2022 school year.

#### Virtual Learning Students – Elementary and Secondary.

There is a lessened trend in the current 2021-2022 school year for parents/guardians to choose the Virtual Learning option for their children versus In-person learning. It is approximately a 75% drop from last year's demand. It was a Provincial Ministry of Education directive to keep virtual learning as a board wide option for students in both the Elementary and Secondary panels. The chart below summarizes last year's (2020-2021) demand for this fully online learning option for students versus this year's (2021-2022) registrations of Oct. 31st for each year. It is unknown whether the LKDSB will be directed to offer Virtual Schools in the following 2022-2023 school year.

#### **Financial Considerations**

Strong fiscal management is an important component of Ontario's publicly funded education system. Ontario's Ministry of Education states, in their *Achieving Excellence*: A *Renewed Vision for Education in Ontario*, 2015 that "public trust is built when the education system makes decisions based on evidence and research, and when it is seen as a good steward of public resources." This focus has led to changes in how the Ministry provided grant funding for education in the province. The LKDSB believes accountability is attained through open dialogue, transparency and fiscal responsibility. This includes effectively allocating resources in order to maximize impact on student learning at the school level.

#### Schools and the LKDSB Capital Replacement Program

The LKDSB currently operates a total of 62 school sites – 50 in the elementary panel and 12 in the secondary panel. Despite the fact that the LKDSB spends its annual maintenance and capital improvement budgets, its buildings continue to deteriorate as they age. The LKDSB is located within the Ministry of Education London Region in Ontario which encompasses Southwestern Ontario. The average age of school buildings within the LKDSB exceeds both that of the Provincial and Regional averages.

The LKDSB receives grant funding on an annual basis to carry out capital repair and maintenance program on school facilities. Capital projects are prioritized based on school need and condition. The capital needs and condition of the schools is used to calculate the Facility Condition Index (FCI). The FCI is a common facilities management benchmark that compares the relative condition of a group of facilities. The FCI compares the total cost of required capital work in LKDSB schools against the replacement value of those same schools. A facility with a high FCI would generally require a larger capital investment than a similar sized facility that has a lower FCI. High FCI scores are generally found in older buildings. The following tables summarize FCI data for LKDSB schools for a 5 Year and a 10 Year FCI calculation.

#### **Capital Planning**

The LKDSB's annual budget contains capital renewal funding, which is comprised of School Renewal Grants and School Condition Grants. Both of these grants are applied to the capital needs of the LKDSB's facilities in the following areas:

- Building Shell including walls, foundation and roof;
- o Building Site Work including parking lots, sidewalks and playground asphalt;
- o Building Systems including heating, plumbing, electrical; and
- o Interior Spaces including classroom interiors.

Current annual funding is not sufficient to cover the current capital needs of the LKDSB, which is resulting in a sizable funding gap. Additions to LKDSB facilities may be funded from alternative Ministry of Education grants. These grants are application-based requiring the LKDSB to complete a separate application for each capital request. Each request is evaluated by the Ministry of Education, with only approved projects receiving funding. The LKDSB competes against other school boards for this application-based funding and can only submit projects when available funding programs are announced by the Ministry.

#### Additional considerations / options moving forward for long term planning:

Due to the continuing moratorium on school closures and consolidations, some of the prior phases laid out in the original LKDSB PAR document have become dated. As such some will require additional review and revision once the moratorium is lifted. Some of the approaches below should be taken into consideration when reviewing the phases above: These considerations are not and should not be considered Program Accommodation Reviews nor should they be considered approved by Trustees.

- 1. Complete a City of Sarnia Elementary School Boundary Review to assess more efficient use of facilities with respect to predicted student FTE counts and future program needs.
- 2. Repurpose London Road Public School to include adult and continuing education programs, community partners and specialized programming currently located at Great Lakes Secondary School following the John N Given Learning Centre model.
- 3. Maintain Queen Elizabeth II (Sarnia) and undertake a new build on the existent site, right sizing the school to match population.
- 4. Build a new elementary French Immersion Program school on the site of Lakeroad Public School consolidating students from the French Immersion programs at High Park Public School and Cathcart Blvd Public School.
- 5. Close Alexander MacKenzie Secondary School. Convert and modernize Errol Road Public School to house state of the art technical programs. The proximity to Northern Collegiate Institute & Vocational School will permit students a full range of programming.
