


It is historically significant, and allows for some history to be researched, created, and most importantly, easily located. "Sarnia-Clearwater" was the name of our proud city for one year back in 1991, although we realized the simple beauty of "Sarnia" shortly thereafter. Nevertheless, this has my vote for many reasons, and does the Sarnia community justice by keeping a "namesake" school. Chatham, Lambton, Blenheim, Ridgetown, Tilbury, Wallaceburg, and numerous elementary schools all bear their locality's name. Sarnia, a very significant city in our region, is the only city of its size in the Lambton-Kent DSB that may no longer have a namesake school. Thus, I advocate for the school whose name begins with "Sarnia." I least like "Great Lakes" simply because such a region is enormous, and unclear whether it is American or Canadian. There is also an existing "Great Lakes" Christian high school near Hamilton that comes up on Google search. I would also vote against "Bluewater" because there is a Bluewater District School Board, which simply causes too much confusion.
