East lot has 58 parking spaces. West lot has 30 parking spaces. Total of 88 spaces. Currently, 64 of the 88 spaces are used for staff parking, leaving only 24 spaces for student and visitor parking.

Both parking lots require the remarking of lines and numbers.

The parking or paved driving space available is inadequate for the amount of traffic generated by bus use, parent and student drivers, visitor parking etc. during peak times. There is insufficient parking during scheduled events (Parents' Night, SCITS Revue, tournaments, etc.)

There is only one designated handicapped parking spot.

Measures that the school board has identified and/or addressed for accessibility of the school for students, staff, and the public with disabilities (i.e., barrier-free).

A number of areas of the building are not accessible. Specifically the stage and balcony, the library, the pool area and the small gym.

The only automatic door is the west external door ramp. This is a considerable distance from the Gym area and the Cafeteria.

There is a functional elevator located on the first floor, serving second and third floors, that is accessible from the east door where there is a ramp from the parking lot. There are three steps up to the first floor elevator level from the front door, and steps from the west parking lot to the west door. From the back of the building, two south doors are level entries, but the back addition is at a lower level than the first floor of the original building. There is a ramp from the tech addition up to the first floor just outside Room 121.

The accessible washrooms are on the 2nd floor (easier access from the auditorium).

There is no elevator or wheelchair access to the Library, Gym C, the pool, or the change rooms that serve these facilities.

Four adult and seven youth groups use the gymnasium/s for volleyball, soccer and basketball as well as the Army and Air Cadets for their annual ceremonial parades. A stamp group uses the cafeteria. A wrestling club uses the wrestling room. Theatre based groups and community organizations rent the auditorium as well as a commercial dance company. A concert band uses the music room. Track group use the hallways. Other annual events:

PRIORITY SCHOOLS INITIATIVE (PSI) OVERVIEW:

The Priority Schools Initiative, a component of Community Use of Schools is also funded by the Ministry to support schools located in communities that need it most, allowing not-for-profit groups free after-hours access to school facilities.

- There are 220 designated 'priority schools' located in 38 Ontario school boards.
- The designated schools are intended to be located where they can effectively address the needs of communities/neighbourhoods where socioeconomic or other barriers would otherwise hinder CUS access and programming.
- The Ministry has designated SCITS as a 'priority school'.
- Any requests for substitution of Priority School must be accompanied by a sound rationale and if necessary supporting documents indicating why and how a school board will continue to serve user groups of the current Priority School.
- If a board fails to submit a request for substitution by the end of May the request will likely be held over to the following school year for review at that time.
- Approvals of substitutions are conditional on the board providing the Ministry with satisfactory rationale that the changes meet the intent of the program.

Various community basketball, soccer and volleyball organizations use the gymnasium/s. A local stamp group uses the cafeteria. A local wrestling club uses the wrestling room. Sarnia Police Service also use the wrestling room. Various theatre based groups rent the auditorium.

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
Existing School Boundary Areas for: Sarnia Collegiate Institute & Technical School (SCITS); St. Clair Secondary School (SCSS); No
