Reports from First Nation Communities	Kettle & Stony Point First Nation Zandra Bear-Lowen reported that: -A lot of change has occurred namely a new Chief and Council and a new principal at Hillside Elementary School -There is an Education Cultural Coordinator working with the students from K-12 -October 20 is FNMI AQ event at Kettle & Stony Point for the 25 LKDSB teachers registered in FNMI Additional Qualification Course through Lakehead University Delaware Nation at Moraviantown -Kim Sonneveld reported that: -Involved in ongoing Immersion program within the community -Kim acknowledged that the community appreciates the flexibility shown by the schools -Teachers will be in their Immersion program for the entire school year -A Language Facilitator is being hired -A Language Facilitator will help coordinate resources -The Language Facilitator will meet with Mary Ann Patterson to look at what has been created and what needs to be created Walpole Island First Nation Everett Kicknosway reported that: -The new principal at WDSS has introduced herself -The Immersion Program has 7 people involved Aamjiwnaang First Nation -Vicki Ware reported that: -Most schools participated in Orange Shirt Day -Queen E, Sarnia had organized events planned by Deb Plain with guest speakers -VTRA Training attended by 5 Aamjiwnaang staff-felt to be very valuable -Still in the process of developing the Education Services Agreement -Discussed the registration of the upcoming FNMI AQ course-program is just about to capacity -Vicki is working on coordinating events for the teachers to go to			

Trustee: Lareina Rising	-Lareina explained the role of the Indigenous Trustee -The Memorandum of Agreement has been distributed but discussion has not been completely held. The document was dispersed, and discussion needs to occur before being presented to the board -Lareina wanted to be sure all processes run smoothly with funds and uses -Lareina reported that Jane and she were at a Board meeting and agree that the board has great administrators that will help navigate through the process of funding -Education Services Agreement and negotiations are moving along the same path and are effective -Jane Bryce commended schools on the #orangeshirtdayLKDSB	
Reports from Administrators	-Reports were submitted by Administrators prior to the meeting - Don Zondag, JMSS, read his report stating Student Council is planning and leading Orange Shirt Day activities Naahii Ridge -Mary Ann confirmed the Immersion program taking place and its importance for the future of the Language - A teacher has been hired to replace Native Language Teacher and are working together on content a lot of planning has taken place and Apple programs will help -dual language books have been created by students and school is looking for parents to give permissions to share A.A.
