Bob Bressette and David have begun making phone calls to families regarding attendance. Ongoing PD and curriculum writing have been provided to staff. David is looking for any suggestions/solutions regarding attendance issues and stated that he would appreciate an invitation to meetings related to attendance challenges and solutions via e-mail at education.director@kettlepoint.org. Jenna Southen, Indigenous Lead reported that she is helping students prepare for transition to post-secondary.</p> <p>Vicki Ware, Aamjiwnaang First Nation - Education Coordinator Vicki reported that Jeff Brosh and Pam Gallant read 'The Right to Read' from the Ontario Human Rights Commission to staff which is helping us build capacity at the local level. Vicki also reported that they have been busy with a new policy called 'Reciprocal Education Agreement written notice' which requires the Community to invoice the board for six students that are attending Aamjiwnaang School.</p>
