Reports from First Nation Communities	<ul> <li>Eelünaapéewi Lahkéewiit – Jolene Whiteye <ul> <li>We are continuing with the lunch program for students at RDHS and Naahii Ridge.</li> <li>We are also partnering with RDHS to assist with the cost of pizza on Fridays.</li> <li>53 families were given gift cards for groceries and school supplies.</li> <li>The Health Centre has provided dinner for families.</li> <li>We are working with the Health Centre to contact families and we will be providing gift cards for Fleetway in London.</li> <li>Our Kindergarten classes are still closed.</li> <li>Fishing season has begun.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Bkejwanang – Dr. Cathy Martin <ul> <li>We welcomed students back today after a two-week preventative closure due to COVID.</li> <li>Maple syrup was started by the students and finished by the school administrators.</li> <li>We are sponsoring a book written by Edwin Taylor, an early years centre worker which will be published. Trustee: Lareina Rising	<ul> <li>Director Howitt has been very good at providing updates to us when anything significant is going on such as NLSS closing for two weeks and asymptomatic testing clinics.</li> <li>COVID Vaccinations are rolling out – First Nation communities are in Phase 1.</li> </ul>

Indigenous Lead - Dallas Sinopole	<ul> <li>The Board Action Plan was presented by Dallas</li> <li>Dallas has been working with the Indigenous team and Superintendent Lane to utilize some of the money from the BAP.</li> <li>We are providing teacher PD around May 17<sup>th</sup> – for 2 weeks long which will be after hours workshops. We have two local keynote speakers which we are very excited about. We will be sending invitations to all teachers and administrators.</li> <li>We are also working on PD sessions for language teachers.</li> <li>We recently have been given funding from the Ministry to create summer Grad Coach positions. We would like to offset some of the costs through the BAP and add to or match the funding from the Ministry.</li> <li>We would like one Grad Coach from each region and these positions would run from mid-April to the end of August to help Gr. 8 students transition to Gr. 9.</li> </ul>	
Reports from Administrators	<ul> <li>Administrators provided their reports electronically (25) and verbally, giving description of school events.</li> </ul>	
Superintendent: Helen Lane	<ul> <li>We are one of four school boards to organize asymptomatic clinics that are being held in schools. Kent Orr and staff from CLASS have stepped up to organize.</li> <li>We are dealing with COVID on a daily basis. School case numbers are going up as well as community case numbers.</li> <li>At North Lambton we had classes who had to self-isolate as well as staff members. Due to our inability to staff the building, we closed the school for this week and will be re-opening it this coming Monday, March 22/21.</li> <li>There was a directive from our HR dept. that any PD or unnecessary meetings be rescheduled.</li> <li>ATEP (Aboriginal Teaching Education program) through Queen's University has now changed to ITEP(Indigenous Teaching Education Program). We will be posting a coordinator position. We had 10 applications and 10 accepted applications.</li> </ul>	- Helen will send the posting to First Nation communities once it's ready.
