Call to Order: Director Howitt called the Annual Organization Meeting of the Board to order at

7:00 p.m. and explained that as per the LKDSB Procedural By-laws Section 2.3 and the Education Act Section 2.8, the Director presides over the meeting until a

Chair of the Board is elected.

Traditional Territorial Acknowledgement

Director Howitt read the Traditional Territorial Acknowledgement.

Director Howitt advised that the official returns of the election of the Trustees for the Board have been received from the various Municipal Clerks as well as notice from the First Nation partners and the Declarations of the Office and the Oaths of Allegiance pursuant to the provisions of the Education Act have been completed and filed. He congratulated all Trustees on being elected or appointed to the position of Trustee to govern the LKDSB. He remarked that it was a new beginning for the Board, but the focus on the Board's Mission, *Fostering Success for Every Student, Every Day*, will continue. He relayed to Trustees that the guidance and direction they provide through the LKDSB Vision, Mission, Strategic Priorities, and Policies and Procedures resonate with LKDSB staff who work directly with students. He thanked Trustees for their service to LKDSB students over the next four years.

Director Howitt noted that since the last Organization Meeting, challenges brought forth from COVID-19 continued, but activities have now returned to schools. He remarked that the *Right to Read* report released by the Ontario Human Rights Commission highlighted the importance of early intervention to support the ability to read for primary students, which will continue to be a significant focus for the LKDSB, and strategies recommended in the report will be implemented. He added that LKDSB Graduation rates and test measures all demonstrate that our students need support to meet and exceed provincial averages. He commented that COVID-19 is not gone and will continue to present challenges, but student academic outcomes and well-being must have equal billing to ensure student success.

Director Howitt remarked that he is very proud of the work of LKDSB staff, who consistently put students first, and is awed by the achievements of LKDSB students. He thanked the Associate Director, Superintendents, and Director's Office staff for their work and focus on students, and for supporting staff so they can support students. He noted this connection is similar to Trustees, who through governance set the conditions for Senior Administration to

operationalize the Strategic Priorities they put before them through staff for students.

Performance by the Great Lakes Secondary School Jazz Band Superintendent Hazzard introduced Derek Stenton, Principal of Great Lakes Secondary School and welcomed the Great Lakes Secondary School Jazz Band and teacher Chitra Dath.

Greetings – Superintendent Lane Superintendent Lane brought greetings with poem *Teach the Children* by Jon M. Nelson and welcomed the new Board of Trustees.

Summer Social Emotional

Learning Camps – Superintendent Barrese Superintendent Barrese introduced System Coordinator Chris Moore, Mental Health Lead Katie Colameco, LKDSB Social Worker Karla Veens, and former student leaders in the program Sophia Barrese, Tristan Bhola, and Maddie Nemcek.

Superintendent Barrese reported that in Summer 2022, Social Emotional Summer Learning Camps were held for students across the district which supported five critical areas of focus: inclusion and belonging; student-centred approaches; caring adults; learning disruptions; and community outreach/supporting families. She noted that these areas of focus align with the Board's Strategic Priorities.

System Coordinator Moore explained that staff reported students were struggling to manage social situations and were demonstrating lagging skills regarding social interactions, play, and conflict resolution, and the camp focused on providing instruction and support to develop these identified lagging skills to better prepare the students for a full return to school in September 2022. He noted that 12 post-secondary students were employed as Caring Adults, and they were provided training from the LKDSB Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) on creating a caring and welcoming environment, how to be a caring adult, and how to provide support to students if needed.

Mental Health Lead Colameco reported that LKDSB Social workers were available at all camp locations to provide parents/guardians with information about community connections and guidance around managing situations like anxiety, family connections, sibling and peer conflict, and general family wellness. System Coordinator Moore further added that Social Workers provided parents/guardians with family time activity ideas, and various gift cards were distributed to families to encourage them to plan extracurricular outings.

Social Worker Karla Veens remarked that students were really engaged in the camp, and the free programming was a great opportunity for families. Sophia Barrese, Tristan Bhola, and Maddie Nemcek relayed that theme weeks were popular with the students, and the camp was a great opportunity for students to build social emotional skills.

A Trustee asked if there was an opportunity presented to members of the four First Nations communities to attend the camp. Superintendent Barrese responded that information on the camp was shared through the schools, to the Special Education Advisory Committee, and through Board communications. She added that many school administrators and MDT members advertised the calendar for the camp at community locations.

A Trustee asked if there is a budget available for the camp to run next year. Director Howitt responded that the funding will be available next year as it was multi-year funding.

A Trustee asked how much participation there was from virtual program students. Superintendent Barrese responded that they did not ask which school the children were from and noted that every child who attended was welcome to take part in the program.

Supervised Alternative Learning Report Report B-23-07 Trustee Fletcher reported on the 2021-2022 Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL) Committee, which was composed of Trustees Greg Agar, Randy Campbell, Ruth Ann Dodman, Jack Fletcher (Chair), System Coordinator Paul Wiersma, and Community Representatives Leslie Helferty and Rosa Zamudio. He noted that LKDSB resource staff, including SAL Coordinator Dennis Meston, Student Engagement Clerk Karen Bieber, Attendance Officers Andy Collins and Lis Hoskins, Indigenous Student Re-Engagement Workers Yvette Capiau and Mary Whiteye, and secondary school principals and vice-principals, attended the committee meetings. He noted that Trustee Dodman is the new SAL Chair and encouraged Trustees to review the report.

Ontario Public School Boards' Association Update (OPSBA)

Trustee Fletcher reported that the next OPSBA Board of Directors meeting will be held on November 27, 2022 and will then meet with local Members of Provincial Parliament (MPP) on November 28, 2022.

Ad Hoc Naming Committee for the Kindergarten to Grade 12 School in Forest Report B-23-08 Director Howitt reported that the initial steps are taking place to move forward with the established Ad Hoc Naming Committee for the Kindergarten to Grade 12 School in Forest, Ontario. He noted that Trustees Bryce and Fletcher were appointed to serve on the committee through a November 27, 2018 Board Motion. He added that Senior Administration will work with principals of the schools involved to collect the names of the other members of the committee, including a representative from Kettle and Stony Point First Nation.

Trustees Bryce and Fletcher confirmed they are still willing to be on the committee, and there were no changes to Trustee membership requested from Trustees.

Summer Social Emotional Learning Camps Report B-23-09 Superintendent Barrese thanked Trustees for permitting the Summer Social Emotional Learning Camps presentation earlier in the meeting and relayed Trustees to the Board Report for additional information.

Trustee Questions

A Trustee noted they attended the open house meeting regarding Brooke Central School and asked for more information on the concerns parents/guardians brought forth and how Senior Administration plans to address these concerns. Director Howitt remarked that Senior Administration has made a commitment to be as transparent as possible with the school community throughout the process, and updated communications are released as promptly as possible. In response to the question, he noted there were various concerns expressed at the meeting, including the concern raised regarding the temporary relocation of Grade 6, 7, and 8 students to a secondary school, specifically regarding the boys' washroom being located on a different floor than the classrooms and the potential for interaction with secondary school students. He explained that the plan for the Grade 6, 7, and 8 students has been revised, and they will now be located at Brooke Central School. He added there are no concerns with the roof in the section of the school where they will be located, but an engineer will be brought into the school to confirm. He reported that another concern was the splitting of families and explained that there was no LKDSB school that could fit all of the students, but the plan was made to allow for the least amount of splitting of students as possible. He noted that parents/guardians asked about placing

students in a building within the community, and although consideration was given to this option, there were security concerns given the age of the students, and it was decided that keeping the students in school buildings was more appropriate. Another concern raised was not having the opportunity to visit the schools where the students will be temporarily located prior to their children arriving, and open houses have now been planned at the schools. He explained there was also concern raised about the engineer's report, and it was vocalized that a further opinion on the report should be sought. He explained that the engineer's report states there is an issue with the roof, putting the safety of students, staff, and those who visit the school at risk, and there was no choice but to move forward with the transition. He added that getting another opinion would delay the process and noted that a lawyer was consulted. He relayed that staff have risen to the challenge and have done everything they can to move the students from remote learning to in-person learning at the schools as soon as possible, and the plan is for students to be at their temporary locations on Wednesday, November 30, 2022.

Associate Director McKay explained that in emergency situations the Director and Associate Director have the ability to begin work with a contractor without having to go through the tender process, which would have taken eight weeks. He reported this situation was deemed as an emergency, so they are already working with a contractor in order to begin the work as soon as possible. He reported that there may be a supply chain issue with steel, but they will know more when they better understand the scope of the work.

Following a Trustee question, Associate Director McKay confirmed that the contractor being used on the project is Wellington Builders.

Following a Student Trustee question, Superintendent Mancini confirmed that courses that are Indigenous based are primarily M level courses, which qualify for college or university. She was not aware of any Indigenous based courses that did not qualify a student for college or university.

SUBJECT: Indigenous Liaison Committee Report



The November 16, 2022 meeting of the Indigenous Liaison Committee (ILC) was held via TEAMS with Trustee Jane Bryce chairing the meeting. Principal Ben Lawton gave the Traditional Territorial Acknowledgement as part of the opening of the meeting.

Reports from the First Nation Communities were received:

Kettle and Stony Point First Nation

Education Director David Ennis from Hillside School has reported that Bob Bressette is focusing in depth on addressing student attendance issues and will share the learning with staff. David introduced Jenna Southen who is new to the role of Indigenous Lead at Kettle and Stony Point. Jenna is working and learning with secondary principals in the LKDSB. A preliminary meeting with staff members and Elders was held to bring Indigenous perspective to the curriculum. The school has started a progressive after school program which has proven to be very successful. The hope is that over time it will lead to a variety of learning options based on the current season and for the children to learn different skills. Serious thought has also been given to dedicating a week to learn off the land in the spirit of land-based learning. Community member Patti Shawnoo formed a boy's drumming group that performed at the Remembrance Day ceremony last week. The community is excited to have Roberta Northmore as the new LKDSB Indigenous Trustee who has proven to be a real asset at Hillside School.

Vicki Ware, Aamjiwnaang First Nation

Education Coordinator Vicki Ware reported that the school participated in 'Rock your Mocs Day' where students received new moccasins. Vicki reported the school received notice from The Bookkeeper stating that they are making a donation to the school which was made possible by donating the proceeds from Orange Shirt Day. The school received \$2700 to purchase new books for the library. Two staff members will be attending Indspire which is a national gathering conference held in Winnipeg next week. The community celebrated the retirement of Janet Steadman who was a long-time education support worker at Sir John Moore school and presented her with a blanket as a way to thank her for her years of service. The JK/SK class was invited to the City Hall Inaugural event where they sang 'O Canada' in Ojibwe.

Eelünaapéewi Lahkéewiit

Education Manager Jolene Whiteye reported that the community held a Truth and Reconciliation event on September 30th which saw a tremendous turnout of approximately 160 participants. Over three days, the Lunaapeew Heritage Circle, which is a grassroots group run by volunteers from the community, organized this annual event to learn, share and celebrate Lunaapeew heritage, culture and language. This year's event included dip net fishing knowledge sharing, ribbon skirt making and a youth panel discussion. On November 30th the community was able to resume its in-person Remembrance Day Service with students in grades 4-6 from Naahii Ridge Public School in attendance. After the service everyone was treated to lunch at the community centre. Anushiik to the students for the attentiveness and respect they showed during the service and also to all the Eelûnaapéewi Lahkéewiit departments and leadership that made this event memorable.

Trustee Bryce extended a warm welcome to Roberta Northmore, First Nations Trustee for LKDSB who will be chairing future ILC meetings. The next board meeting is on Nov. 22nd. Trustee Northmore introduced herself indicating that she has been in education for 29 years. She would like to meet with each of the four First Nation communities to discuss how she can represent each community on the ILC.

Superintendent Lane encouraged the four First Nation communities to submit their written notices to the Board. Dallas Sinopole has been working on the BAP and will contact the four First Nations to have a conversation regarding the final report. Superintendent Lane noted that Dallas and a few other staff members are attending an Indigenous Leads Gathering in Toronto this week as well as the team is attending the Indspire Conference in Winnipeg next week. Superintendent Lane shared some very exciting news that Denise Helmer-Johnson who is the former VP at CKSS has been hired as the System Coordinator of Equity, Diversity and Inclusion. Superintendent Lane has been busy visiting her family of schools. CUPE staff have given their 5-day notice of strike action which will commence on Monday, November 21st unless a deal is reached. For those who are interested in applying to become a student of ITEP must do so before the Dec. 1st deadline.

Administrators from 54 schools submitted reports from across the district and these reports are now being archived on the staff portal for all LKDSB staff to be able to reference. School Reports

The Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) of the Lambton Kent District School Board met in person at Wallaceburg District Secondary School on Thursday, November 17, 2022. Following is a report of the activities of the meeting:

Business Arising from the Minutes

There was no business arising from the meeting of October 20, 2022.

Presentation: Introduction to the Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario

Martin Smit, English Language Educational Consultant with Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario, shared information regarding the provincial organization, outlining resources and supports available to individuals and families dealing with a learning disability. Mr. Smit also touched upon their organization's involvement with the Human Rights Tribunal's 'Right to Read' Report and the work they'll be doing over the next few years to help the Ministry, and School Boards, institute changes/improvements when it comes to curriculum and the methods used when teaching students to read.

October 31, 2022

Superintendent Barrese noted that, as of October 31, 2022, there were 2,221 elementary and secondary students formally identified as being 'exceptional' as a result of an IPRC. An additional 2,241 elementary and secondary students haven't been formally identified but have an IEP in place and receive varying levels of support.

Correspondence

A letter dated October 14, 2022 from the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (attached) was discussed. As a result, the Committee asked administration to investigate the number of individuals within our Board who have inquired about remaining in school beyond 21 years of age. Administration will bring the information to the December 2022 meeting.

Dear Minister Lecce,

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board's Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) is deeply concerned about the impact the last 2 1/2 years of this COVID pandemic has had on the education of the students we represent.

We are writing to request that the Ministry of Education consider providing the option to extend the time students with differing abilities have to remain or continue in Secondary School beyond year 7 and beyond age 21.

The "Ontario's Plan to Catch Up", which you have publicly announced, is a welcome starting point to address some of the educational gaps brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. We too are very concerned but despite the huge impact this pandemic has had on student learning and well-being, we have yet to hear or understand explicitly how your Ministry (and perhaps other applicable Ministries within the government) plan to address the gaps currently faced by <u>diverse</u> learners. Specifically, how are you addressing the gaps experienced by those diverse learners who have graduated or are currently nearing the end of their secondary school education?

Many of the students we represent could not learn online or even attend online. They had no instruction or experiential learning during the first couple of waves because in person learning was not available. And when special education classrooms did eventually open and remain open, these students were unable to benefit from integration into regular classrooms, extracurricular activities, or socialization with students in the mainstream; nor did they have the opportunity to learn from cooperative work experience essential to successes needed in life because it was not available or severely limited in the community. There were and are also vulnerable diverse learners in other programs who have failed to reach their potential or even come close due to similar circumstances and missing the time needed in school and with peers. Parents and guardians of diverse learners could not provide even similar opportunities that the school system could; many of these families struggle with

disparities in income, time, and many other resources which the pandemic worsened as statistics have shown us all. The school system also carries an intricate network that can access opportunities much more readily than parents. For example, there are teams of teachers and ERWs who not only teach, but organize and coordinate co-op opportunities, liaise with businesses in the community, develop resumés, and provide support at the co-op work location.

"Education For ALL" and universal design are good for all but absolutely necessary for special needs students. With some students, we believe that it is a fundamental accommodation that your Ministry consider the option to also extend the time that students can remain in high-school or return to high school to enable their own education recovery, whether that means extending the 7 year maximum for high school, or providing Boards with the funding to accommodate students within other special education programs. We are advocating for the most vulnerable students who require additional time as part of their accommodation to "catch up" and close the gaps experienced during this COVID-19 pandemic. The loss of integration time, cooperative experience, and the learning available within a school system can drastically change the post-secondary trajectory for the most vulnerable students SEAC represents.

We appreciate your attention to this very important matter and look forward to your reply.

SUBJECT: LKDSB Pupil Accommodation Report 2022-2023



The LKDSB Pupil Accommodation Report 2022-2023 is presented to the Board in compliance with LKDSB Regulation No: R-AD-106.

On April 27, 2018, the Ministry of Education released a revised Pupil Accommodation Review Guideline (PARG).

Revisions made to the PARG:

- Additional public meeting(s), which extends timeframes, for a standard pupil accommodation review;
- Extending the timeframe for the first public meeting from 30 to 40 business days;
- o Extending the timeframe between the first and final public meeting from 40 to 60 business days;
- New requirements to be contained in the Initial Staff Report, including the use of a Ministry template for the report:
 - A recommended scenario and at least two alternative scenarios, which could include the status quo, to address the accommodation issue(s);
 - The recommended and alternative scenarios must address the following four impacts:
 - Impact on student programming;
 - Impact on student well-being:
 - Impact on school board resources; and
 - Impact on local community.
 - If one of the schools included in the pupil accommodation review is eligible to receive support from the Rural and Northern Education Fund (RNEF) at any time, an impact on the local economy must be completed using the Ministry approved template.
- Promotion of community input in the pupil accommodation review process and inclusion of student voice;
 and
- Consideration of elementary student input.

The LKDSB incorporated the revisions into the LKDSB regulations on *Pupil Accommodation* in May 2018. At the time, school boards were still waiting for the release of templates for the Initial Staff Report and the economic impact assessment. The Ministry had indicated that it would provide some funding to school boards to complete the economic impact assessment, as well as list approved companies.

In June 2018, the moratorium on school closures was re-introduced by the Ministry of Education and school boards were advised that the provincial government would be reviewing the school closure process. A date for the release of the revised process has not been set.

As per LKDSB Regulation No: R-AD-106, the purpose of the LKDSB Pupil Accommodation Report 2022/2023 is to summarize data in order to provide an overview of accommodation issues across the geographic area of the Lambton Kent District School Board. The study of current student enrolment, demographic and financial data, as well as Ministry of Education initiatives, is key to future planning. Some of the data included in the LKDSB Capital Plan June 2022 is included in this report.

The data presented in this report indicates that the LKDSB faces two ongoing challenges: demographics/declining enrolment in some geographic areas of the board and financial challenges, including the support of under-utilized schools and the maintenance of aging facilities.

Enrolment & Demographics

- LKDSB has 22,275 students as of October 31, 2022;
- o LKDSB's Ministry-rated empty pupil spaces is 7,761 as of October 31, 2022;
- LKDSB's current capacity utilization as of October 31, 2022 is 74.16%; and
- LKDSB's projection of enrolment continues to fluctuate, and capacity utilization is 21,786 students in 2026 (72.53%) and 21,665 students in 2032 (72.13%).

While Statistics Canada predicts that the birth rate in Ontario will increase from 2017 to 2027, Lambton and Chatham-Kent birth rates and the projected student population is expected to reflect a neutral trend in birth rate in the LKDSB area in comparison to the province. This Statistics Canada data is supported by the Board's demographic software.


LKDSB's Enrolment History

In the 2021/2022 school year there was a 7.23% decline in overall student population compared to enrolment ten years earlier in the 2012/2013 school year as outlined in the chart below. Enrolment in the LKDSB has experienced decline since amalgamation in 1998.

In the 2021/2022 school year, our elementary enrolment increased by 323 students over the previous school year. Secondary enrolment increased by 196 students over the previous school year.



Current LKDSB Enrolment

Elementary enrolment as of October 31, 2022 was 14,881 students, which represents an increase of 286 students in comparison to the 2021/22 elementary average daily enrolment (ADE) of 14,595. ADE is calculated by averaging the total enrolment on the Ministry funding dates of October 31 and March 31 of the school year. It is important to note that in the 2021/2022 school year, elementary enrolment increased by 98 students on the March 31, 2022 Ministry funding date in comparison to the enrolment on October 31. Over the past three years, there has been a slight increase in elementary enrolment (average of 64 students) for the March 31 reporting date. In September 2022, additional registrants from other provinces, countries and school boards outside of the LKDSB catchment area are contributing factors to the enrolment increase, as well as students returning from home school.

As of October 31, 2022, six elementary schools have student populations under 150 students. Those schools are: Mooretown-Courtright Public School with 106 students; Zone Township Central School with 118 students; Dawn Euphemia Public School with 121 students; Aberarder Central School with 122 students; Bridgeview Public School with 135 students; and Riverview Central School with 146 students.

Secondary enrolment as of October 31, 2022 is 7,394 students, an increase of 333 students in comparison to enrolment on October 31, 2021. Secondary enrolment is projected to fluctuate over the next 10 years as a larger elementary class moves to secondary.

As of October 31, 2022, three of twelve secondary schools have current student populations under 400. Ridgetown District High School's Grade 9-12 enrolment with 117 students; Blenheim District High School with 221 students; followed by Tilbury District High School with 353 students.

Note 1: Of the TDHS 353 total students, 224 are regular day school program students and 129 are attached to the ACCESS program of which approximately 90 students are enrolled in the regular day school co-op program. Other ACCESS program students are enrolled in a combination of Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL), regular day school classes and online courses.

Note 2: Lambton Kent Composite School has been removed from this sub-400 student FTE list as the Virtual – Learning Program for Secondary Students has been tied to their location (BSID) for support and monitoring purposes. The regular day school in-person FTE is 241 students, and the Virtual FTE student count is 180.

This enrolment data may fluctuate based on additional student admissions and/or departures that will occur throughout the school year. It is also important to note that not all secondary students will be funded as full-time students.


Summary of Current Enrolment for the 2022/23 School Year

In 2021/2022, the LKDSB had 8,421 empty pupil spaces as of September 20, 2021, with a utilization rate of 72.07%.

For the 2022/23 school year, the LKDSB's total enrolment has increased from the September 20, 2021 enrolment of one year ago. As of October 31, 2022, there are 14,881 elementary students and 7,394 secondary students. The 2022/23 utilization rate of 74.16% has increased and the LKDSB has 7,761 empty pupil spaces.

Birth Rates

Birth data on a Board-wide basis for the period of 2002 to 2020 illustrates a range in the number of births. The birth graph below shows a relatively stable birth rate occurred from 2004 to 2012. In 2013 and 2014, the birth rate showed a more significant decline. An increase in the birth rate was experienced in 2015, 2017 and 2019. However, the decline continued in 2016 and 2018. The Board has remained consistent over the last 6 years; the number in 2018 marked the lowest on record since the year 2000.




Data sources used by the Board's planning software to determine the birth rate include the Provincial Birth Registry, Canada Child Benefit information, and available Census data.


Provincial Birth Rate and LKDSB Catchment Area Birth Rate Assumptions have been removed from the projections. The 2016 Census is now 5 years old and is less valuable and outdated in terms of its accuracy. The 2021 Census data will be released over the course of this 2022 year, and new birth assumptions will be available for future projections. Given the stability in the number of births since 2013, the assumption made in this projection is that the number of births will remain similar.

LKDSB Projected Enrolment


Elementary headcount is projected to continue to decline, but at a slower pace than was anticipated one year ago. In 2023, a high of 14,648 elementary aged students is projected. Ten years later, in 2032, the elementary enrolment projection is 14,438, a decline of 210 students. This projection would result in an average of twenty one less elementary students, per year, over the next ten years.



Secondary enrolment (under 21) is projected to fluctuate over the next ten years, due to larger elementary class moves to secondary. In 2032, an estimated headcount of 7,227 is projected, resulting in a decrease of 98 students over the 2023 projection of 7,325 total students. This includes projected student participation in the International Education Program. It is important to note that with secondary enrolment, not all students in this headcount will be funded as full-time students.



Overall student enrolment in the LKDSB is projected to continue to decline, as outlined in the Projected Board Enrolment chart below.



By 2032, projections indicate that the overall LKDSB enrolment is expected to decline by approximately 308 students.

- Enrolment for JK-Grade 8 is projected to decrease by 210 students;
- Enrolment for Grades 9-12 is projected to decrease by 98 students;
- Ministry-rated empty pupil spaces will be 8,485; and
- Capacity Utilization will be 71.86%.

Please note that the Secondary Virtual Learning Program has been moved to Lambton Kent Composite School as of the 2021-2022 school year. In-person FTE count is 241 pupils as of October 31, 2022.

This figure includes approximately 129 students who are enrolled in the A.C.C.E.S.S. (Acquiring Current Curriculum Experience through Supervised Studies) Program at TDHS. This program supports students, primarily from low-German Mennonite families involved in seasonal work, in pursuing academic goals and achieving their O.S.S.D.

Financial Considerations

Strong fiscal management is an important component of Ontario's publicly funded education system. Ontario's Ministry of Education states, in their *Achieving Excellence*: A *Renewed Vision for Education in Ontario*, 2015 that "public trust is built when the education system makes decisions based on evidence and research, and when it is seen as a good steward of public resources". This focus has led to changes in how the Ministry provided grant funding for education in the province. The LKDSB believes accountability is attained through open dialogue, transparency and fiscal responsibility. This includes effectively allocating resources in order to maximize impact on student learning at the school level.

Schools and the LKDSB Capital Replacement Program

The LKDSB currently operates a total of 62 school sites – 50 in the elementary panel and 12 in the secondary panel. Even though the Board spends its annual maintenance and capital improvement budgets, its buildings continue to deteriorate as they age. LKDSB is located within the Ministry of Education London Region in Ontario which encompasses Southwestern Ontario. The average age of school buildings within the LKDSB exceeds both that of the Provincial and Regional averages.

The LKDSB receives grant funding on an annual basis to carry out capital repair and maintenance program on school facilities. Capital projects are prioritized based on school need and condition. The capital needs and condition of the schools is used to calculate the Facility Condition Index (FCI). The FCI is a common facilities management benchmark that compares the relative condition of a group of facilities. The FCI compares the total cost of required capital work in LKDSB schools against the replacement value of those same schools. A facility with a high FCI would generally require a larger capital investment than a similar sized facility that has a lower FCI. High FCI scores are generally found in older buildings. The following tables summarize FCI data for all

Capital Planning

The LKDSB's annual budget contains capital renewal funding, which is comprised of School Renewal Grants and School Condition Grants. Both of these grants are applied to the capital needs of the LKDSB's facilities in the following areas:

- Building Shell including walls, foundation and roof;
- o Building Site Work including parking lots, sidewalks and playground asphalt;
- o Building Systems including heating, plumbing, electrical; and
- o Interior Spaces including classroom interiors.

Current annual funding is not sufficient to cover the current capital needs of the LKDSB, which is resulting in a sizable funding gap. Additions to LKDSB facilities may be funded from alternative Ministry of Education grants. These grants are application-based requiring the LKDSB to complete a separate application for each capital request. Each request is evaluated by the Ministry of Education, with only approved projects receiving funding. The LKDSB competes against other school boards for this application-based funding and can only submit projects when available funding programs are announced by the Ministry.

SUBJECT: Budget Meeting Schedule for the 2023-2024 School Year



The Board's annual budget process, for the 2023-24 school year, will begin in February 2023. This report establishes the budget schedule that will guide the planning of revenues and expenses, for the upcoming 2023-24 school year.

The meeting timelines proposed below will be used to guide the budget development process. The timelines will ultimately depend upon the date when the Ministry provides school boards with the grant regulations.

- Development and release of the initial budget memos, by the Ministry of Education, is anticipated to begin in mid-February 2023. The release of the technical paper and access to EFIS is anticipated to be available by the end of March 2023.
- Budget Workshops for Trustees and Administration: April 4 and May 2, 2023; all meetings begin at 5:00 p.m., at the SEC and CREC with video conferencing and Microsoft Teams options available. Meeting invites will be sent to all trustees.
- Presentation, review, public input and development of the budget, as required, at the public Regular Board Meetings on April 11 & 25 and May 9 & 23.
- Budget Information Sessions: Student Senate May 1, Parent Involvement Committee
 May 8, Indigenous Liaison Committee May 17 and Special Education Advisory Committee - May 18.
- Final approval of the 2023-2024 Budget is scheduled to be presented at the June 6, 2023 Regular Board Meeting (contingency plan, if required - June 20, 2023 Regular Board Meeting).

SUBJECT: Secondary School Survival Skills Summer Workshop for Students



Thanks to funding received from the Ministry of Education through two projects – *Re-engagement & Reading Assessment Support* and *Summer Transitions* – the Lambton Kent District School Board (LKDSB) was able to offer inaugural "Secondary School Survival Skills Summer Workshop for Students" during July and August of 2022.

As per the scope of work for the projects, the summer camp supported three critical areas of focus, namely:

- Learning Disruptions
- Inclusion and belonging
- Community Outreach/Supporting Families

Students in Grades 7-10 registered themselves to participate in the "Secondary School Survival Skills Summer Workshop for Students" held at secondary schools throughout the LKDSB in July and August. The Workshops were developed to support students focused on learning essential skills for success at the secondary school level. The camps provided opportunities for students to engage with their peers and LKDSB staff during the summer, and to help promote a smooth transition to secondary school in September 2022.

Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) Specialists, supported by educators and educational assistants, led day-long camps from 10:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m. at five (5) school locations. The locations were Wallaceburg District Secondary School, Lambton Central Collegiate & Vocational School, John McGregor Secondary School, Great Lakes Secondary School, and Chatham-Kent Secondary School.

Learning Disruptions:

The transition from elementary to secondary school can be challenging. Through adequate transition planning, developing relationships, and reinforcing academic, social and emotional skills, students are able to experience academic and well-being success at the secondary school level.

Inclusion and Belonging:

Students had the opportunity to develop positive peer connections, learn organization and planning skills, develop daily routines and healthy lifestyle habits and focus on engaging in leisure and self-regulation breaks. All LKDSB students were invited to participate in these activities to help support a positive transition to school for the 2022-2023 school year. There was no cost for participants to engage in these camps. In total, 32 students participated. The program provided access to our self-contained ALLP classroom space in order to use the kitchen for food preparation as well as the combined areas for peer connections. Each camp offered one-day workshops with students being able to attend more than one session if they wanted. Students were permitted to participate at any of the available locations.

Community Outreach/Supporting Families:

Interested families were encouraged to contact their child's school to learn more about the camp and to register for this initiative. Once students were registered, the ABA Team contacted families to learn more about their child(ren), their strengths, and any areas of need. Personal connections with families and their students allowed our school teams to prepare individualized support and connections.

By utilizing feedback from participants and summer staff, adjustments will be made to programming being developed for future offerings. We plan to continue to offer the program at a variety of school sites, and to expand our parent resources and training materials.
