Presentation – Philosophies of Universal Supports	<ul> <li>System Coordinator Carrielyn Smith introduced Applied Behavoiur Analysis's Mariah Walker and Josalyn Lyons.</li> <li>Mariah and Josalyn spoke about the philosophies of universal supports for students, what they are and how they can be implemented into the classroom.</li> <li>They explained the triangle of intervention, which includes understanding how to identify behaviours, highlight student strengths, and use this information to guide and support safety plans.</li> <li>Mariah and Josalyn also said that the application of these supports has reduced behaviours and increased successes in the classrooms.</li> </ul>
