Presentation - Philosophies of EA Supports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> System Coordinator, introduced Student Support Services/Well-Being Coordinator Jeff Brosh. Jeff presented on The philosophy of Educational Assistants (EAs) within the LKDSB During the information sharing, focus was on who may receive support from additional caring adults, including EAs; the parameters surrounding why EAs may be reallocated throughout the school year; and the guidelines for an EA’s 7-hour workday. Jeff explained the role EAs and other caring adults may have in the tiered intervention supports currently being implemented within our LKDSB schools, including how these 	

	<p>supports are adjusted once student independence and classroom learning capacity grow and evolve.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jeff said that the new model is asset-based, forward-thinking, and focuses on what our students can do instead of deficits and weaknesses. • Jeff also shared how EAs support students in various ways, such as riding the bus before and after school, working alongside teaching staff with extracurricular activities, supporting the breakfast program, assisting with homework clubs and athletics, and building positive relationships within the school. 	
Presentation – Philosophies of Universal Supports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • System Coordinator Carrielyn Smith introduced Applied Behaviour Analysis’s Mariah Walker and Josalyn Lyons. • Mariah and Josalyn spoke about the philosophies of universal supports for students, what they are and how they can be implemented into the classroom. • They explained the triangle of intervention, which includes understanding how to identify behaviours, highlight student strengths, and use this information to guide and support safety plans. • Mariah and Josalyn also said that the application of these supports has reduced behaviours and increased successes in the classrooms. 	
Special Education Plan Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carrielyn Smith informed the members that the Special Education Plan is reviewed annually and provides monthly amendments. • For March, no amendments were proposed. 	
Role of the Resource Teacher	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Superintendent Barrese advised the group as part of the board’s strategic priorities and organizational plan, the Student Support Services/Well-Being department will undergo a comprehensive review of the Role of the Resource Teacher this year. • Superintendent Barrese highlighted that priorities and needs have changed since the role was last defined and updated in 2004. • Feedback from agencies and school board partners was encouraged. • A more in-depth update will be provided at the April 18, 2024 SEAC meeting.
