myBlueprint

For students transferring into CKSS from a school using myBlueprint they will have their accounts sync'd to the school. If you do not have an account, one will become available to you after registration. Peer Helpers

All Grade 9 students have the opportunity to request a Peer Helper or Tutor. Peer Helpers are senior students available to talk <u>confidentially</u> with grade 9 students to "help" them adjust socially during their Grade 9 year. Peer Helpers will also make sure that students know when try-outs are for sports and dates and times for school clubs.

Peer Tutors and Tutors

Tutors are available to assist students academically. Peer tutors are senior students that volunteer to work with Grade 9 and Grade 10 students in a variety of subject areas. We can also provide resources and contact information for qualified tutors, (for a fee).

Power Hour

The Power Hour program is offered after school from 2:30pm – 3:30pm, Mon.-Thurs. This provides students extra time for homework and academic support service for most subjects. This one hour session is supervised by a CKSS teacher who is available to support students in many subject areas.

School Photographs

Photographs will be taken at the school on <u>Thursday, September 13th, 2018</u>. These pictures will be used for both student cards and the yearbook. Copies will be available for students to purchase if they so wish Graduation pictures will be set up later in the school year. We encourage all potential grads to have their pictures taken; copies will be available for purchase. The First Day at C.K.S.S for Grade 9's.

Lockers

Your locker will be assigned on the day of registration or the first day of school. Locks will be provided by the school. <u>PLEASE LEAVE YOUR LOCK ON THE LOCKER</u>. Any student locks put on lockers prior to this time will be cut off. The school is not responsible for items taken from your locker. Money or other valuables **should not** be left in your locker. Leave them at home. The locker you are assigned will be yours for the duration of your high school career. Please take care of this locker as you are responsible for its condition. Students are <u>NOT</u> allowed to share lockers. All locker concerns should be directed to the main office.

CKSS Student Success Program

The Student Success Team works with school staff, students, parents and the wider community to ensure that, together, we help all students earn the credits necessary to graduate. Through Grade 8 to 9 Transition programs, credit recovery classes, after school homework help sessions, pathways programs, etc., CKSS is committed to the success of each and every student.

ESL/ELL Program

Learning Resource Centre. (LRC)

Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) and Dual Credits (For Grade 11 & 12 Students)

The **Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)** is a ministry-approved specialized program that allows students to focus their learning on a specific economic sector while meeting the requirements for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) and assists in their transition from secondary school to apprenticeship training, college, university, or the workplace. CKSS has Arts & Culture, Construction, Health & Wellness and Manufacturing. Sign up today in Student Service!

The **Dual Credit Programs** allows students to take one of 40+ alternative courses offered through St. Clair College and/or Lambton College. There are hands on courses from welding, arboriculture and baking pastry to career exploration courses such as Criminology and Health Care. See Student Services to enroll.

The Cafeteria

Students may purchase reasonably priced hot meals, sandwiches, salads etc. from the cafeteria. They may also bring their own lunches and eat them in the cafeteria. Microwaves are available for student use.

Your Student Council

The Student Council consists of the following executive officers: Prime Minister, Deputy Prime Minister, Secretary and Minister of Finance. Our CKSS Student Council is responsible for organizing assemblies, dances and overseeing the social needs of our students.

Your Student Athletic Association (SAA)

The Student Athletic Association (SAA) consists of students and staff advisors. Its purpose is to assist in the operation of the athletic programme in the areas of fundraising, timing, scoring, selling foods, maintaining roster boards, and taking tickets at all athletic events. The S.A.A. volunteers with the Chatham Goodfellows and many other community organizations. You do not have to be an athlete to join!

Your Arts Council

The Arts Council meets the first Monday of each month. The executive meets weekly. This council organizes events like the annual Arts Fest, the annual Arts Banquet, Cake Walks, Barbeques, and Arts Trips to New York City and Chicago. The Arts Council supports all the arts at CKSS.

Dress Code

The dress code is based on the premise that positive clothing projects a positive image. Clothing that depicts alcohol, vulgarity, sexism, racism, profanity, illegal drugs and/or violence portrays a negative image. By the same token, tank tops for boys and spaghetti straps and backless clothing for girls, and shorts and blouses that expose the midriff are also unacceptable. Students will not wear shorts shorter than mid-thigh or clothing that shows underwear, or see through tops. Slips, bras, boxer shorts, etc. will not be worn as outerwear. Footwear is essential at all times. Student decision making in terms of what to wear is a learning experience; however, the final decision on matters of appropriateness, rests with the Principal. A strict dress code exists in the technology area and the science labs for safety reasons.

Backpacks and Coats

Backpacks and coats are to be left in your lockers as they are a safety hazard in the classrooms. Electronics such as laptops may be used in class at the teacher's discretion.

Physical Education

Physical education students wear a white or yellow T-shirt (Hawk insignia) and navy blue shorts (plain). These are sold at <u>registration</u> and at the school **HAWK SHOP** during the first week of school at a cost of \$35.00 including tax (cash only). We strongly recommend that you buy a uniform on registration day.
