What is the boundary for the school?

- Students outside of the school boundary may attend Great Lakes provided there is room.

Who is eligible for LKDSB provided school busing?

- Students who live 3.2 km or further from the school and who live within the school boundary. For specific information, click on the address eligibility function at https://www.schoolbusinfo.com/
- Students ineligible for transportation may apply for a courtesy seat, which may be granted for one year if there is a bus in the area with room on it.
- Several students purchase a student bus pass and use city provided transportation.

My child has an Individual Education Plan (IEP)? Should he or she attend Great Lakes?

- Great Lakes has programs for students who are able to access grade nine applied or academic courses. A locally developed course in grade nine mathematics is available for students who are very weak in mathematics. Students with IEPs who require curriculum modifications are encouraged to attend Alexander MacKenzie Secondary School. Parents are encouraged to ask their child's grade eight teacher for advice in terms of the appropriate grade nine program.
- Great Lakes has two learning resource teachers and a student success teacher that work with students and the classroom teachers to support student learning.
