Update from School Council Chair:

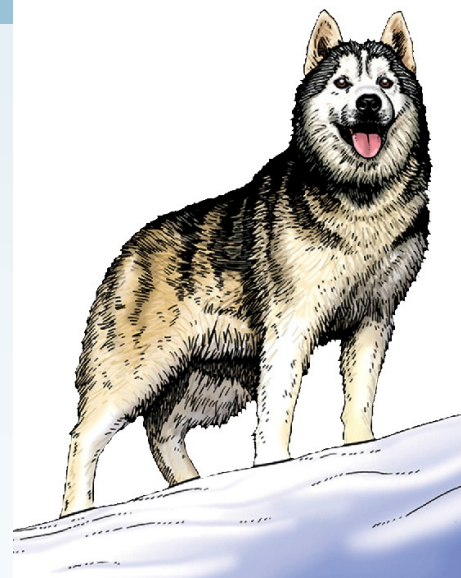
